

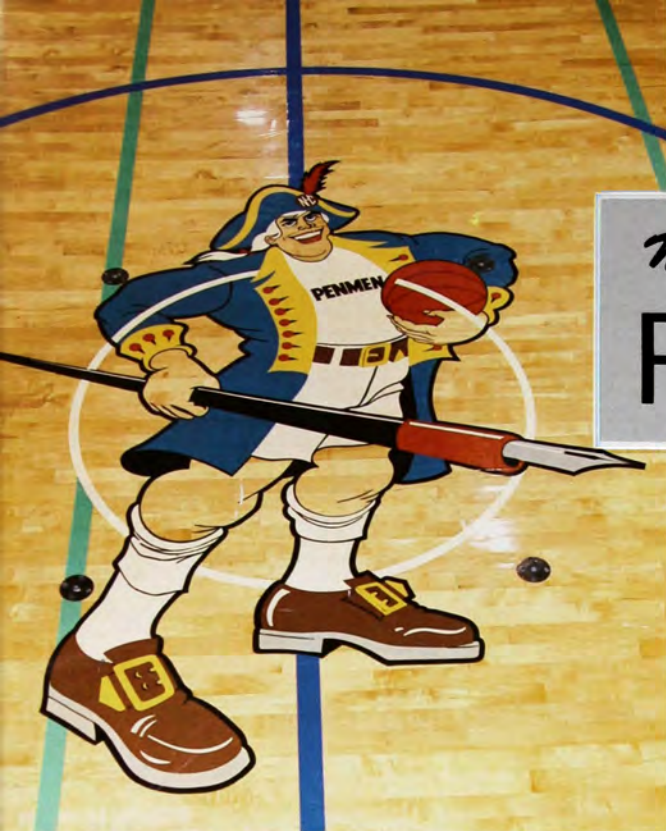

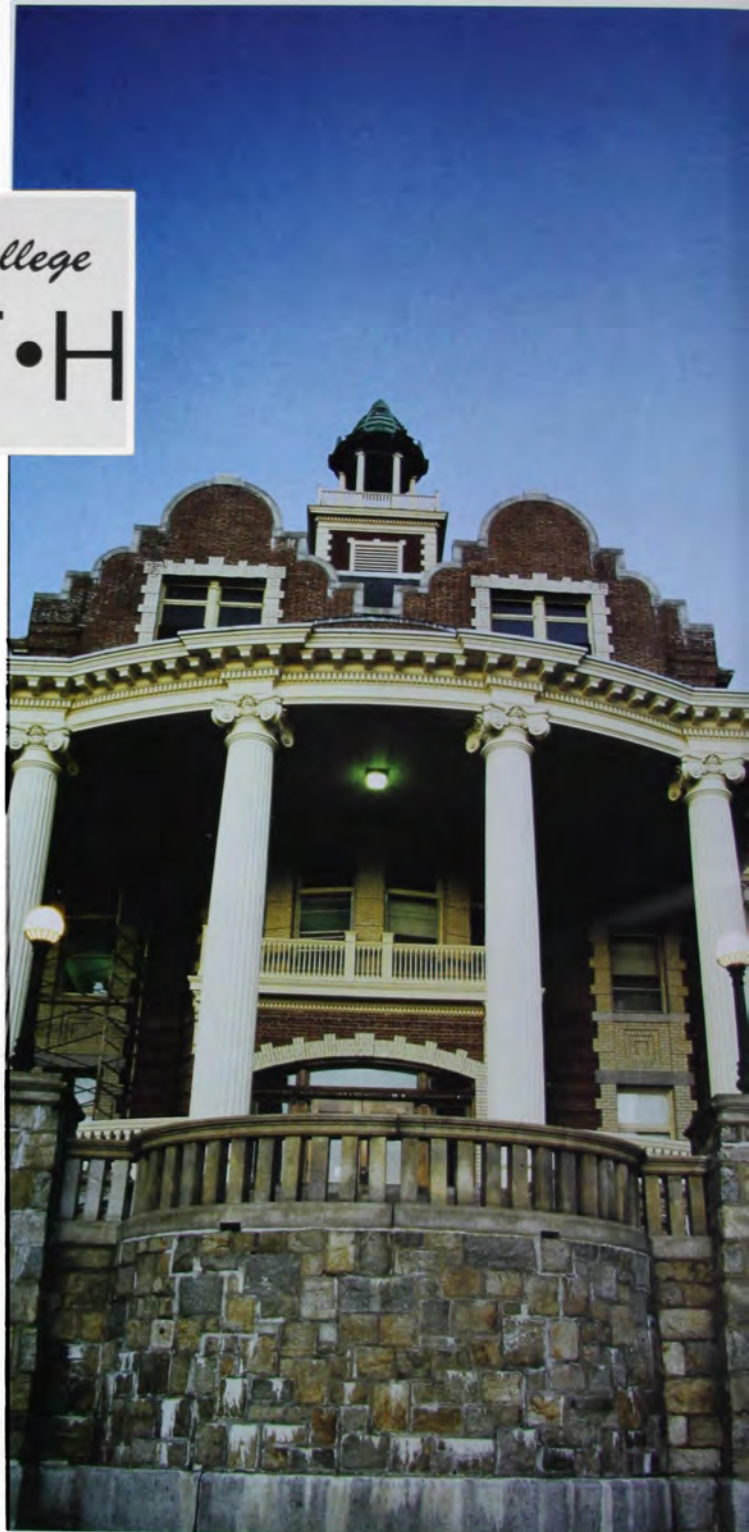

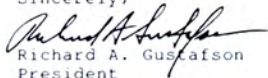
Congratulations to the Class of 1988!! Your graduation from New Hampshire College marks another milestone in your life and we send you on your way confident in the many opportunities which are before you.

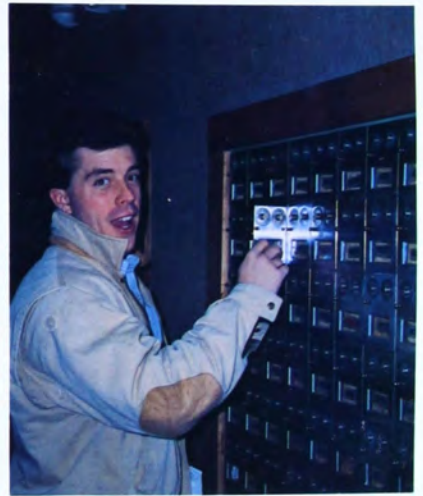

A Man Who Can't Say No

Rob Grabill hangs it up after nine years at New Hampshire College

An era in NHC athletics came to an end this Commencement with the retirement of soccer and ice hockey coach Rob Grabill, who built both programs into playoff contenders and kept life entertaining for hundreds of student-athletes during his tenure on the pitch and the rink.

Grabill came to NHC in 1979 and was faced with a rebuilding task in both sports. The soccer team was coming off a 5-12 season, and the hockey team entered the year with a three-year record of 19-34-2. After posting winning seasons in both sports in his rookie season, Grabill set about the process of upgrading the NHC schedule and attracting quality student-athletes.

The next two seasons were rebuilding ones for the Penmen. The soccer team began the process which would lead to their entry into the NECC, picking up opponents such as Southern Connecticut, Bridgeport and New Haven. The quality of NHC's play went up dramatically, but the wins took a little longer. For the years 1981-1983, the soccer teams were exactly at .500 (27-27-3).

The hockey team matured more quickly, and a ten-game winning streak at the close of the 1982 season signaled the start of a prolific winning stretch for the Penmen. The skaters were 16-6 in ECAC play in 1983, missing the playoffs by a single game. There was no stopping NHC in 1984. The Penmen set every team scoring and winning record in the book, compiling a regular-season mark of 18-6-1, and qualifying for the ECAC and NCAA playoffs.

The glory years began for the soccer team the following fall. The 1984 edition of the Penmen compiled a record of 15-4 and vaulted to the top of the national ratings, elbowing into NCAA tournament contention and signaling to the rest of the NECC that a change was in store. Each succeeding year brought improvement for the potent NHC program as they inched closer to their goal of NCAA playoff action.

NHC compiled a four-year mark of 57-19-4 and hit playoff paydirt in 1986 and 1987, culminating their quest for an NECC crown in 1987 with a 1-0 victory over eventual national champion Southern Connecticut and the college's first ever NECC Championship in any sport.

Grabill received his third Coach of The Year award in four years from the New England Intercollegiate Soccer League, and was also named New England Coach of The Year in 1987 by the National Soccer Coaches Association. He leaves NHC with a tradition of striving for excellence academically and athletically, accentuated but not surpassed by the hundreds of wins which that philosophy has spawned.





Kicking With Both Heels

N.H.C. Men's Soccer Team captures first N.E.C.C. title in school's history.

By any standard, 1987 was a season to remember for the NHC men's soccer team. The Penman compiled one of the best seasons in their history, winning the first New England Collegiate Conference title in any sport in the school's history, and finishing the year ranked 4th among the nation's Division II schools in the final ISAA poll.

The Penman compiled a record of 13-5-2 which included a 5-0-1 NECC mark. Certainly the most significant win of their season was a thrilling 1-0 triumph over Southern Connecticut, which marked the first NHC win ever over their arch-rivals, and gave them the NECC title.

NHC was invited to the NCAA Division II tournament for the second year in a row, and was honored by being chosen as a host site for the opening round game against C.W. Post. The Penman lost a disappointing 1-0 game, depriving them of the opportunity to face Southern Connecticut again for the New England Championship, but even that loss could not dim the luster of a superb season.

Although it was a season of team accomplishments, many individuals received postseason honors. Junior Ron Murphy achieved All-American status for the second season in a row, and a First Team All New England choice. Senior Jon Sakshaug was a All-New England choice for the third time, and was joined on the second team by defender Andrew Toth, the team's Defender of the Year. Murphy and Sakshaug were First Team All-NECC selections, and were joined by Second Team All-NECC selections Mike Martin, Jon Guppy and Doug Blais.

Several graduating seniors will leave their mark on the program after a four year stretch during which the team compiled a record of 57-18-4. Besides Blais, the all time goalkeeping leader, and Sakshaug, who departs as the school's second all time point scorer and third all time goal scorer, the Penman will miss the services of Tom Tusvik, Eivand Nilsen and Joe Cheria.

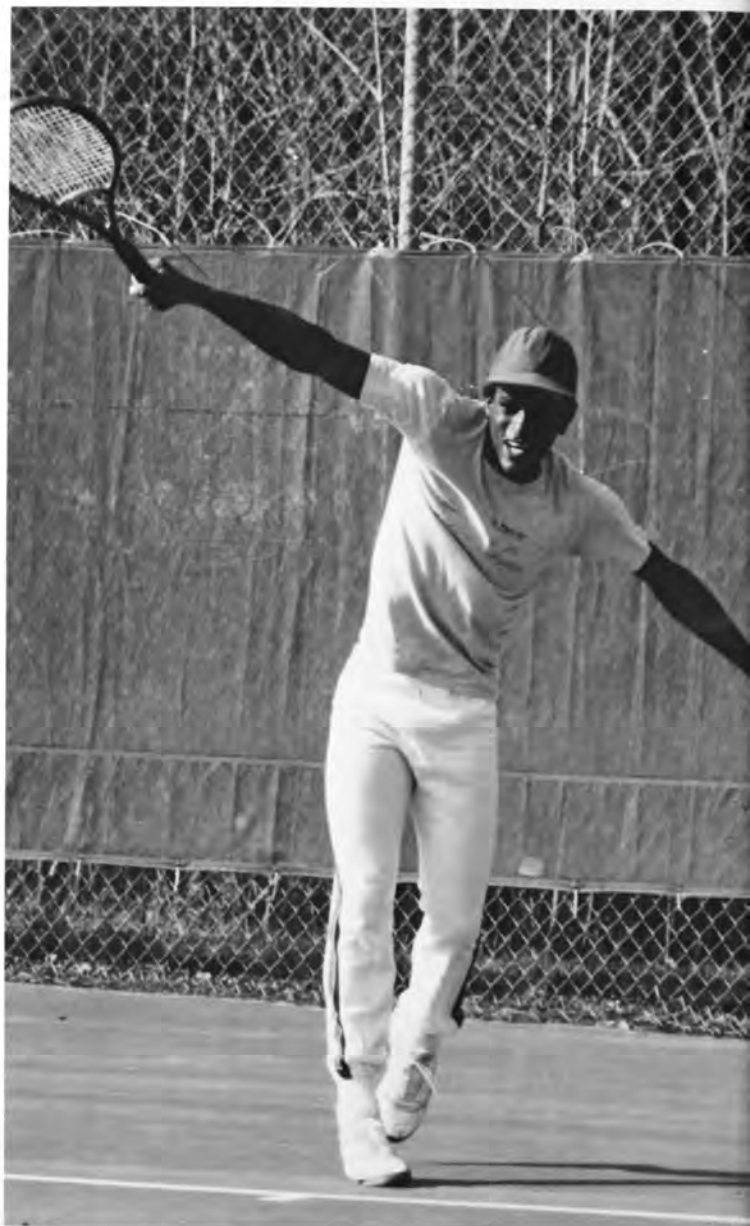


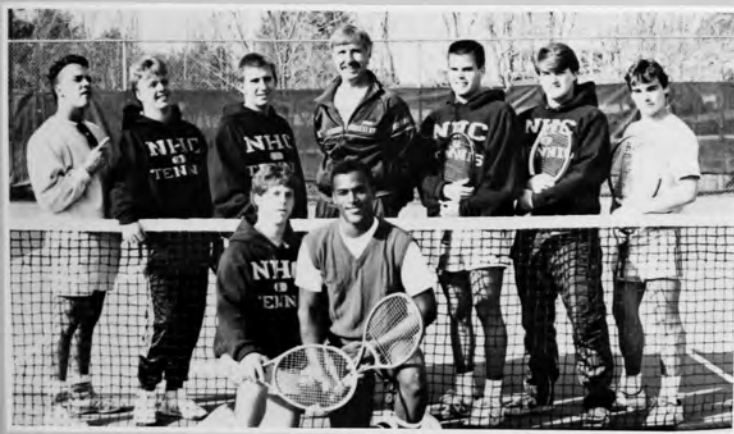
On The Ball In 1988

A Learning Experience

Young Penman Basketball Team shows strong potential for the future

After leading his team to back-to-back NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and the school's third New England title this decade just last season, New Hampshire College men's basketball coach Stan Spirou can chalk up the 1987-88 season as a tremendous learning experience.

After posting 24 wins in each of the past two seasons, the defending New England champs recently concluded a rollercoaster campaign by finishing with a 13-15 record, just the third losing season in the past 25 years of Penman basketball.

"With wins over Lowell and New Haven, we proved that we have the potential to be a very good team in the future," maintains Spirou. "If we receive some leadership and get a couple of recruits to fill in the holes, we could return to the ranks of the New England's elite as soon as next year"

The brightest light in an otherwise dim year was the emergence of sophomore Kirk Jackson as one of New England's most explosive talents. The 6'3" swingman finished third in the NECC in scoring this season, averaging 22.0 points per game for the year and a blazing 26.1 points per contest through his last 12 outings before sitting out NHC's final five games with a cartilage tear in his right knee.

With the graduation of four-years starters Joe Bradley and two-time All-American Cleveland Woods, the brunt of the frontcourt burden was assumed by sophomore Trevor Middleton and freshman forward Willie Scurry. Honored as the NECC's Rookie of the Year, Scurry's superb first-year numbers (9.8 ppg, 7.5 rpg, 57.6 FG%) were matched by his unbridled enthusiasm and intensity, characteristics which enabled him to top the Penman in rebounds on eight occasions.

A Record Season!

N.H.C. Womens Basketball Season highlighted by many new records

After knocking on the door for the past two years, the New Hampshire College women's basketball team finally crossed the threshold by gaining its first NCAA Division II Tournament berth in the program's history this past season. And although NHC's postseason existence proved short-lived, the ending could not detract from what had been a storybook 1987-88 season.

The Penman concluded a surprising 21-8 campaign by falling in the opening round of the NCAA Division II New England Regional to host Bentley, 69-52, but not before setting a new school mark for the most wins in a season in addition to a host of other team and personal records.

Following the graduation of all five starters that finished last season with a heart-breaking 79-76 loss to eventual national champion New Haven in the finals of the New England Collegiate Conference Tournament, most experts chalked up 1987-88 as a rebuilding year for NHC head coach Nancy Rowe. After a 4-4 first-semester start, that forecast appeared fairly accurate.

The school's sixth all-time scorer (829) and rebounder (468) Heidi Bristol was named a First-Time Team All-NECC selection by the league's coaches in addition to earning All-Tournament honors in a losing effort at the NCAA New England Regional. Also enjoying banner seasons for the Penman were Bristol's fellow tri-captains in guard Lisa DeGennaro and forward Diana Harris.

Elsewhere, sophomore Julie Dabrowski continued her emergence as one of New England's top point guards, becoming the first woman at NHC to amass over 200 assists in a single season.

Other key elements in helping the Penman to secure their historic NCAA invitation were juniors Kelly Bourbon and Jackie Hoyt plus sophomore guard Kris Breyer.

Although graduation will exact a heavy toll this spring with the loss of Bristol, DeGennaro and Harris, Rowe believes that the returning nucleus, combined with some promising recruits, could keep the Penman in a position to defend their NECC regular season co-championship next season.

One - goal games highlight a comeback season!

The 1987-88 season was a unique one for the hockey team, which spent the entire season coming from behind, both in the individual games and in the quest for an ECAC Playoff spot. The Penman finished with a disappointing 11-14-2 record, and fell short in their bid to return to the ECAC title chase. If the seasons are measured by a team's cohesiveness and character, however, the 1987-88 edition was a rousing success.

November and December were a disaster for NHC, which stumbled to a 2-9 record. Six of those losses were by two goals or less, setting a pattern of close contests which would last an entire season. The Penman convinced their followers that they were a team of substance, however, upsetting ECAC Division II playoff-bound U Mass Boston 5-4 in the midst of that string.

Refusing to fold in adversity, the Penman started off 1988 with a bang, winning five games in a row to put themselves back in playoff contention. Following a loss to Southern Maine, NHC embarked on a thousand mile pilgrimage to Alabama to face Division I Alabama-Huntsville in a historic pair of games. Playing against the strongest opponent ever, the Penman skated the Chargers to a standoff, coming from behind to tie the 6-6, and then rallying in the second game before falling 6-5.

Boosted by their performance, the Penman swept three straight games from eventual playoff teams, topping ECAC North finalist Tufts, Plymouth and Hawthorne to raise their record to .500 for the first time all season at 10-10-2. Reality intruded with the tough losses to ECAC champion Trinity and Stonehill and after a tough loss to ECAC champion Trinity and Stonehill and after a life-sustaining win over St. Michael's the Penman closed out the year with losses to ECAC North Champion Fitchburg and Wesleyan. Fittingly, the loss to Wesleyan came in overtime after the Penman had rallied from a 6-1 deficit to tie the contest at 7-7.

A world record eight seniors graduate from this years team, although a solid core will replace retiring Rob Grabill. Among the standouts hanging up the blades for the Penman are the high-scoring duo of Jim and John Wood, who finished their careers as the third and fourth alltime goal scorers in NHC history.

Also graduating are two-time Captain and alltime penalty leader John Sullivan, along with fellow defenseman Mike Dolan, and forwards Gregg Cary, Ritchie Philippon, Paul O'Reilly and Andy Bachman.
