**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** 1. Student mail and personal announcements or messages will be placed on the NHC postboard soon to be located outside Dean Beane's office. Students are advised to check daily for any communications.

2. The bulletin board outside Dean Beane's office is to be used for all student activity notices. Club announcements, etc. should be posted only on that board and in the Lounge.

3. By ruling of the Student Senate and the Fire Department, there is to be no smoking allowed in the corridors or classrooms of any building. Smoking is permitted only in private offices, the Student Lounge and the Study Room.

4. The College Snack Bar is open from 7:30 until mid-afternoon, although the Lounge will remain open until 5:00, as will the Study Room. All students are ~~urged~~ <sup>urged</sup> to make use of the Snack Bar--it is there to help you get good food at moderate prices.
