
Learning Center Usage: Oct. 2009 vs. Oct. 2010


The Following charts represent a comparison of Learning Center usage in October 2009 and Learning Center usage in Octo-

ber 2010. The information provided is cumulative from September. Overall, walk-in tutoring, one-to-one tutoring, and peer

mentoring were all tracked to determine where there were areas of increased






usage or decreased usage. In particular, Math, Accounting, and Writing have experienced a great increase in walk-in tutoring

with Accounting nearly tripling. Additionally, there have been three new subject areas in one-to-one tutoring: International Business, Information Technology, and Econom-

ics. Furthermore, Peer Mentoring has doubled in visits and nearly doubled in the number of students being served since 2009.


