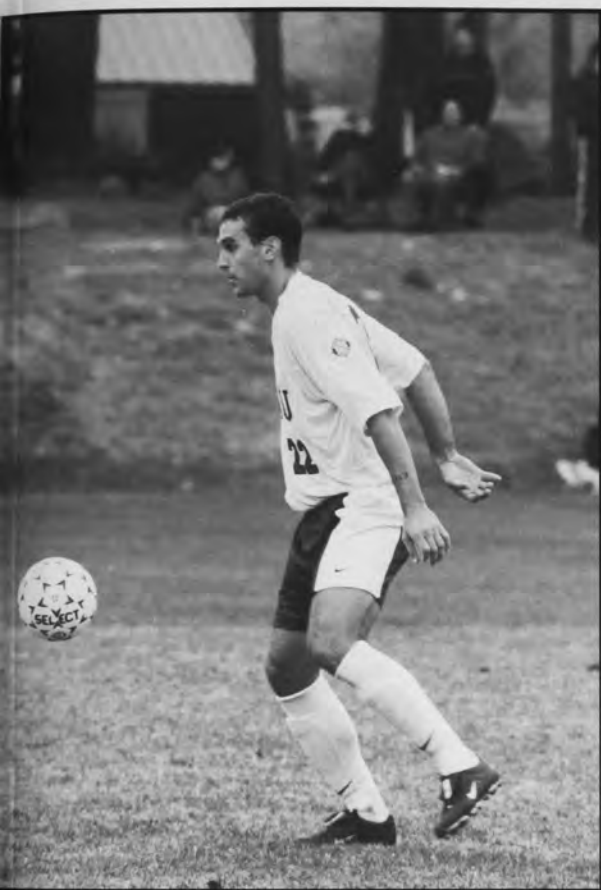
Men's Soccer

The SNHU men's soccer closed out the 2001 season with a 13-4-1 record and ranked 19th nationally in the final NSCAA Division II poll. A fifth-straight bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament was not in the cards through following a 2-0 loss to cross-state rival Franklin Pierce College in the opening round of the Northeast-10 Conference tournament. Highlights of the year included an early-season 0-0 OT battle with nationally-ranked Dowling College and a late-season 2-1 OT victory over Franklin Pierce before a large alumni week-end crowd at Penmen Field.

Several players walked away with individual honors. Goaltender T. Svantesson, defender M. Austin, Midfielders R. Vanrykel & X.

Moshuge & Forward M. Tajiou & C. Riberio all were named to the NE-10 Conference all-star team & also collected NSCAA All-New England honors. Svantesson was also honored as the NE-10 Goal-tender of the year for the second-straight season, and also collected NSCAA All-American Honors for the second-straight year.

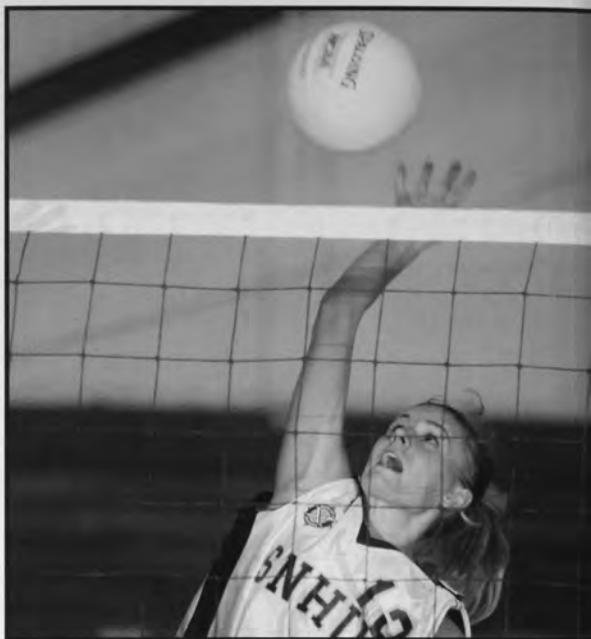

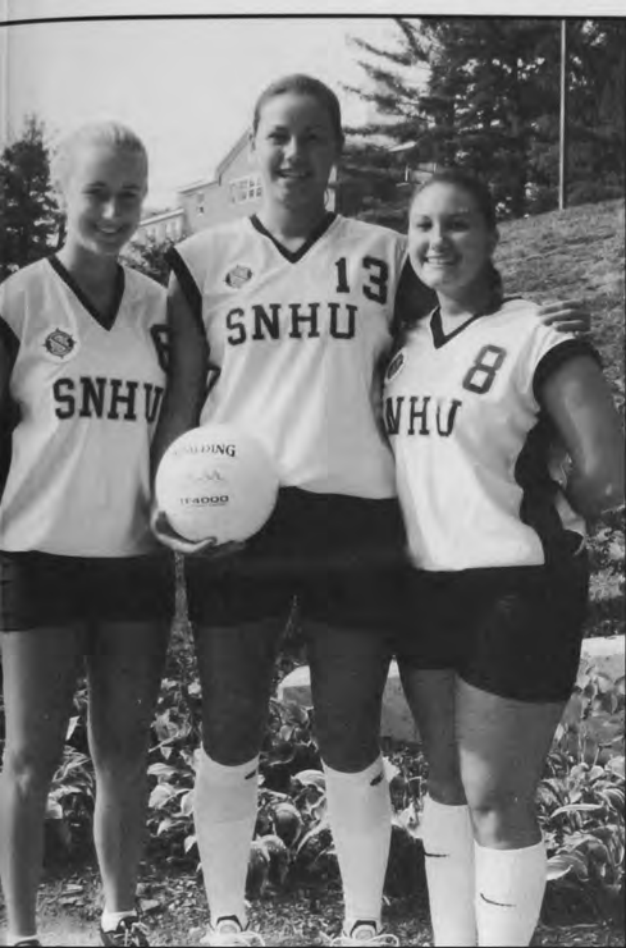

Volleyball

Youth was served for the SNHU women's volleyball team during the 2001 season. The team's 12-player roster featured eight freshmen. While several of those freshmen gained valuable playing experience, the team struggled to earn wins in the competitive NE-10 Conference and closed out the year with a 4-19 overall record and a 2-12 mark in the league. The teams held its own against the top teams in the league and posted league wins over Southern

Connecticut State and St. Michael's College. Freshmen Lauren Enny and Lise Laczek wasted no time in making a name for themselves. Enny led the NE-10 in service aces (85) and led the team in kills (259). Laczek led the team and ranked among the league leaders in digs (276). Fellow rookie Kristin Ellis led the team in assists, while senior Summer Carter recorded a team-high 68 blocks.

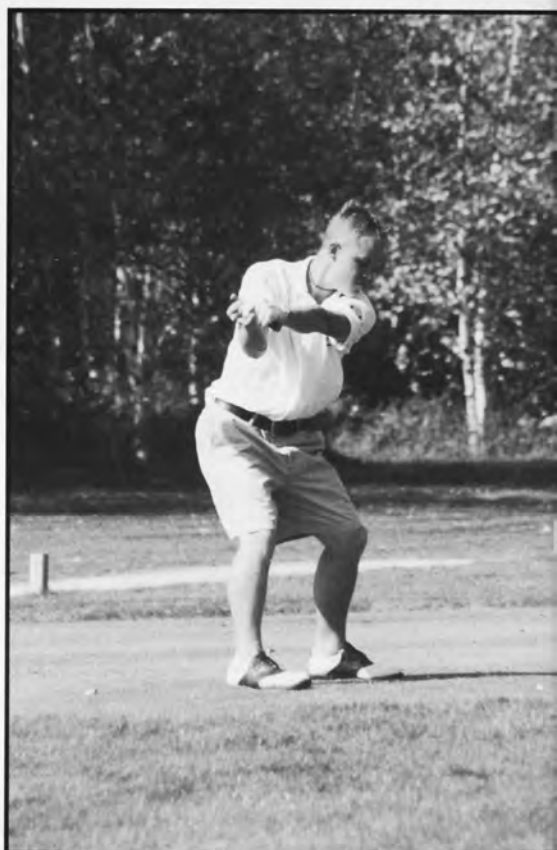

Golf

Just two years after being reinstated as a varsity sport, the SNHU golf team enjoyed a memorable season in which it placed first in four of the seven events they participated in and claimed the Northeast-10 Conference Championship. The Penmen opened the season with back-to-back first place finishes at the Franklin Pierce College and University of Southern Maine Invitational, and then claimed the Northeast-10 after finishing one stroke better than defending champion Bryant College.

Juniors Matt Arvanitis and Chris Rivard led the way all season. Arvanitis won NE-10 Player of the year honors after posting a record setting five-under-par 137 at the NE-10 Championship. He topped the tournament recorded by six strokes. Rivard was the took low medalist honors at the Franklin Pierce, Southern Maine, St. Anselm and W.N.E.C tournament and posted a team-best 75.0 scoring average during the year. Additional team members included seniors Travis Scheyd and Kevin Bracken and Junior Jerome Harty.

Cross Country

The women's cross country team competed in five meets during the 2001 season. The highlight of the year was the fourth place finish out of nine teams at the Regis College Invitionals. The team also competed in the St. Anselm, Stonehill and Bryant Invitionals, as well as the Northeast-10 Conference Championship. Sophomore Kristen Sidie was the top SNHU finisher in all

five meets during the year and posted a season-best time of 21:57 at the Stonehill Invitational. She placed eight out of 79 runners at the Regis Invitational with a time of 22:17. Women's Soccer

The SNHU women's soccer team won three of its final four games and closed out the year with a 7-10-0 overall record a 6-8-0 mark in the Northeast - 10 Conference.

SNHU's eight place finish in the 15-team NE-10 Conference was five spot better then its 13th place finish last year.

A closer look at the team's results shows that 6 of its 10 losses were by two goals or less, including a 2-1 OT loss to nationally-rank Merrimack

and a 4-2 loss to nationally-ranked Adelphi.

Additional highlights of the season included a 7-0 victory over Assumption, a 2-1 OT win over American International and a 4-3 OT win over cross-town rival St. Anselm College.

Sophomore midfielder Anna Turbe and freshman midfielder Lindsay Parks were both named to the Northeast-10 Conference all-star team.

Men's Basketball

The Men's Basketball Team won nine of its final 13 games and closed out the year with a 17-11 overall record. The Penmen finished with a 13-9 mark in the Northeast - 10 Conference, good enough for fifth place in the 15-team league. SNHU rolled to a 104-74 win over St. Michael's college in the opening round of the NE-10 Tournament, before suffering an 88-74 loss to eventual tournament champion Bentley College in the quarterfinals. The Penmen opened the year by winning the University of Bridgeport Purple Knight Classic. 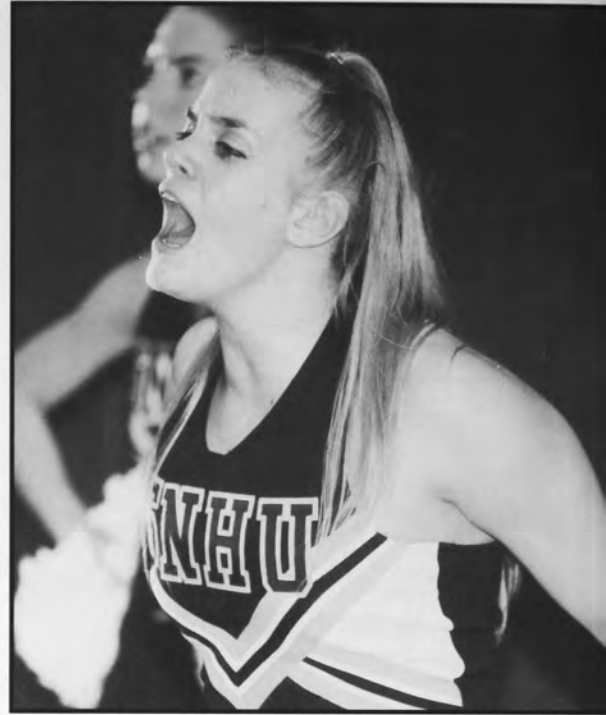

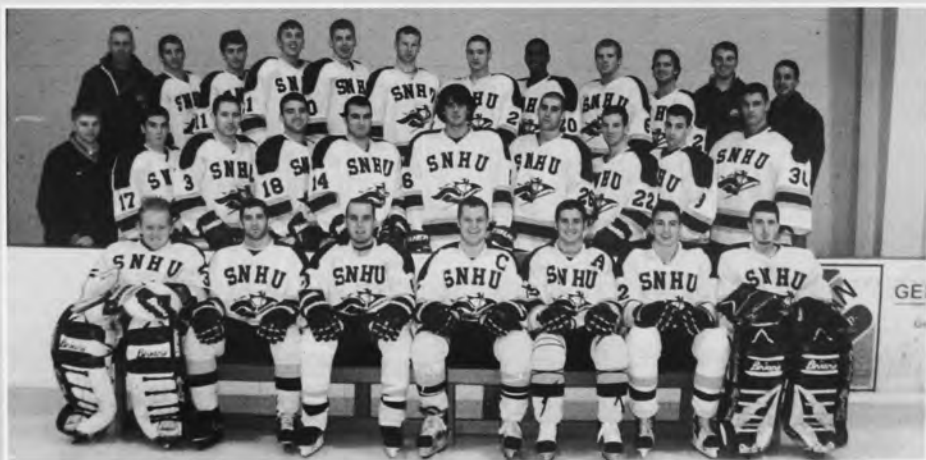

Baseball

The SNHU baseball team posted an 8-33 overall record and a 5-27 mark in the Northeast-10 conference during the 2002 season. The team won three of its first six games, but then hit a slump in which the Penmen won just one of its next 13 games. Close games were the norm throughout the season, as 21 of the teams games were decided by three runs or less-unfortunately the Penmen only won 6 of those 21 games. The highlight of the season included a 7-4 victory over Northeast-10 Pepin Division champions, and defeating NCAA regional champions UMASS Lowell.

Freshman Chris Hart and Mike Bernard passed the offense all season. Hart, the team MVP, batted a team-high .346 with 11 doubles and 20 RBI. Bernard batted .336 with a team-high 26 RBI and became the first freshman in program history to record 50 hits in a season. Senior Ryan Paradise and Nick Nugent both recorded their 100th career hit during the season, while classmate Jon Breault became just the fourth player in program history to register 100 or more strikeouts. Paradise closed out his career ranked fourth in both career hits (131) and career runs scored (93) among SNHU's all-time leaders.

Softball

The SNHU softball team won three of their last four games and closed out the year with a 13-26 overall record and an 8-20 record in the Northeast-10 Conference. The 13 wins were the most in one season since 1991. A much more successful season was within reach, as 24 of the team's 39 games were decided by three runs or less. The team posted a 5-5 record during its week stay in Orlando, Fla. and opened its schedule by sweeping NE-10 rival Stonehill College. Additional highlights of the year included the teams first win over cross-town rivals Saint Anselm since 1994 and a season-ending doubleheaders split with cross-state rival Franklin Pierce College. Newcomer Mel Keeler enjoyed an outstanding season and was named the teams MVP.

She led the team in ERA (1.50), strikeouts (63), hits (33), RBI (13) and runs scored (15). Her 6-13 record was deceiving, as she limited her opponent to one earned run or less in her 12-18 starts-but managed to win just four of those games. Junior Trisha Robinson batted a team-high .278, while classmate Lacy Veilleux had 26 hits and scored 11 runs. Junior Jen Dupuis started 14 games on the mound and posted a 3.55 ERA with 41 strikeouts. She became just the fourth player in program history to record 100 career strikeouts and will enter her senior season just 24 strikeouts shy of breaking the school record for career strikeouts (131) held by current head coach Terry Prouty.

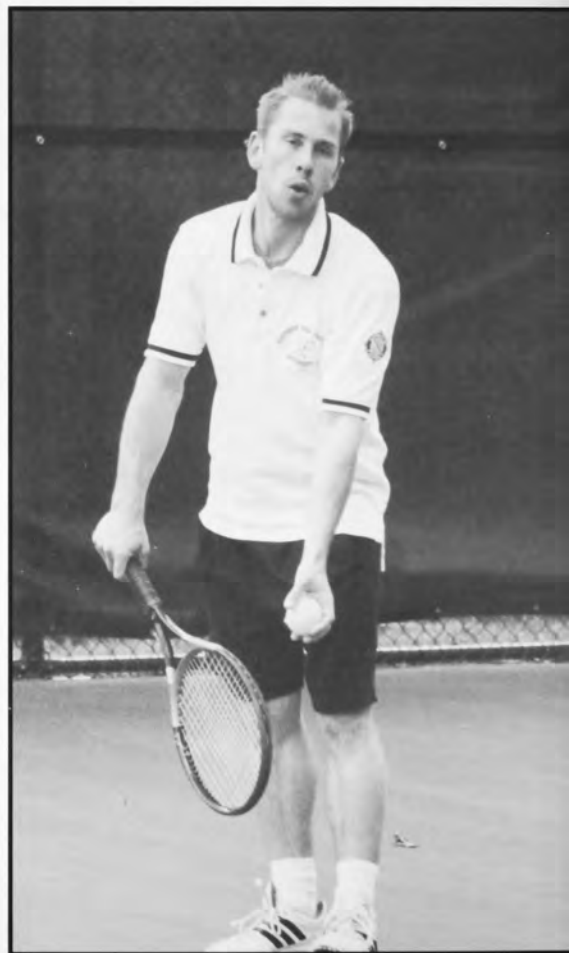

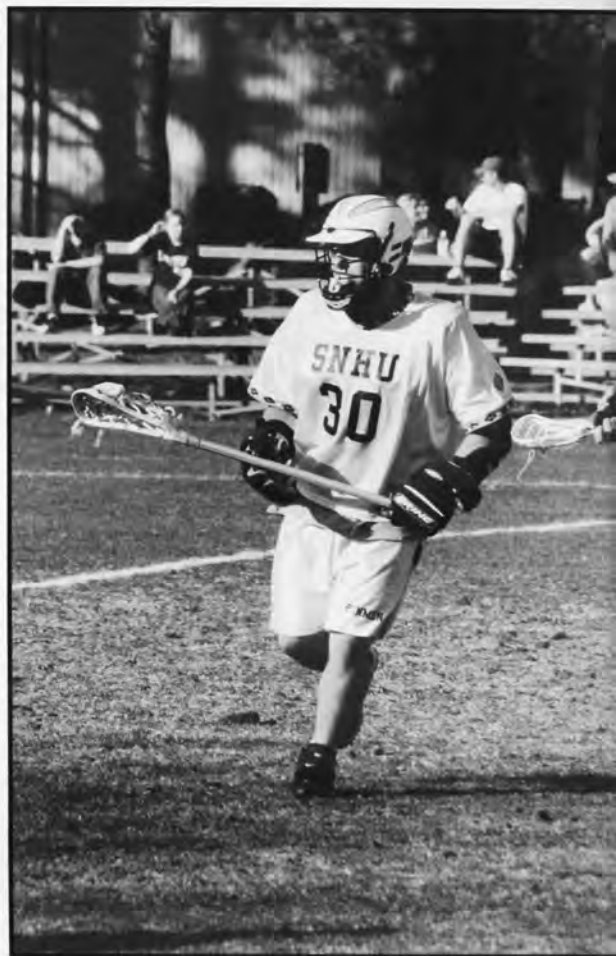

Lacrosse

The SNHU lacrosse team broke even over its final six games and closed out the year with a 5-7 overall record and a 3-7 mark in the Northeast-10 Conference. The Penmen rolled to a 29-9 victory over cross-state rival Franklin Pierce early in the year, and capped the season with a 21-8 victory over AIC. Senior Mike Cesere capped off his record-breaking career in fine fashion. He totaled a team-high 36 goals and 68 points and equaled his team-record for assists in a season (32). He led all Division II players in points per game (5.67) and closed out his career as the program's leader in career goals (157), career assists (94) and career points (251).

Fellow senior Mike Kaskiewicz also enjoyed a solid final season, as he ranked fourth on the team in goals (16) and totaled a career-best 29 points.
