Season Review

The New Hampshire College women's basketball team closed out the 1995-96 season with a 7-19 overall record and a ninth place standing in the New England Collegiate Conference (6-14). Senior captain Kristen O'Connell averaged 7.3 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists in her final season with the Penwomen. She recorded her first ever double-double in a 69-57 loss to LeMoyne with 11 points and 11 rebounds to compliment three assists and four steals. O'Connell scored a season high 16 points in an 87-67 win over Albany and had a career high seven assists in an early season victory over Keene State.

O'Connell played in 98 of a possible 106 games over the past four years and totaled 516 points and 205 assists. Fellow senior Stacy Stackrow shot 43% from the floor and averaged 5.0 points and 3.2 rebounds. Stackrow had 13 points and eight rebounds in mid-season loss to Sacred Heart while shooting 90% (9-10) from the free throw line. She had a career high of four assist in a Franklin Pierce loss. Stackrow totaled more points this season (131) than she did in her first three years combined (124) and closed out her career with 255 points and 233 rebounds in 78 games.

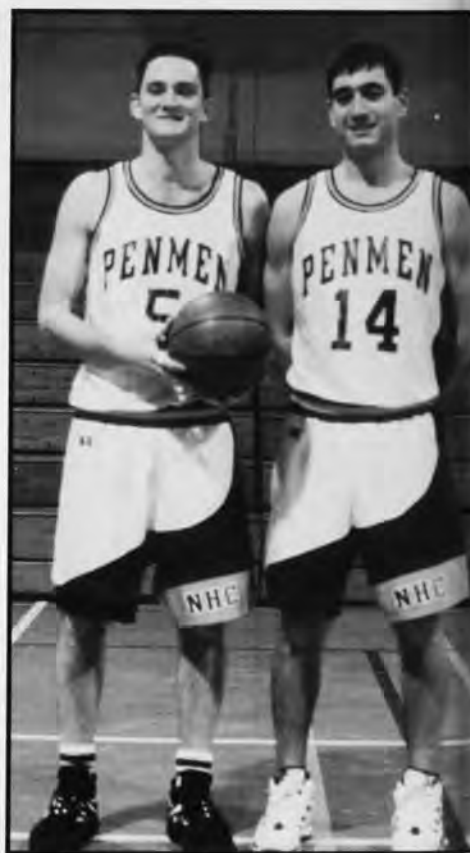

Season Review

The New Hampshire College men's basketball team turned in an impressive showing at the 1996 NCAA Division II Northeast Regional. A fourth-straight regional title was not to be tough and the Penmen closed out the season with a 21-8 record, marking the fifth-straight season NHC has posted at least 20 wins. Seeded sixth in the regional, NHC cruised to a 68-52 win over third-seeded Adelphi. "Even though we were the sixth seed, we went into the regional with one thing in mind.. to win it," said head coach Stan Spirou who has now lead NHC to eight NCAA Tournaments. "I think we played some of our best basketball of the year during the regional, and even

we came up short I thought this team played as hard and as smart as any team I have ever coached." Senior Matt Ripaldi played a large role in the team's success. Ripaldi, who led the Penmen to 105 wins over his career. He scored a season high 26 pts. in an early season win over Keene State and registered his 1000th career pt. in a win over Southern Conn. He played in 123 of a possible 128 games over the past four years. Senior Nick Karageorgos also turned in a strong performance during the year. He made the most of his senior year after seeing limited playing time. He played in 25 games and shot a team high 50% from three pt. land. He has the school record of 10 treys and a career high of 33 pts. in the Keene State game.

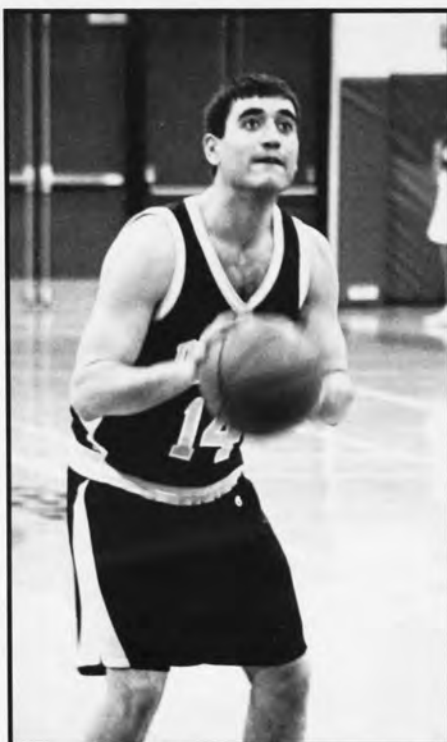
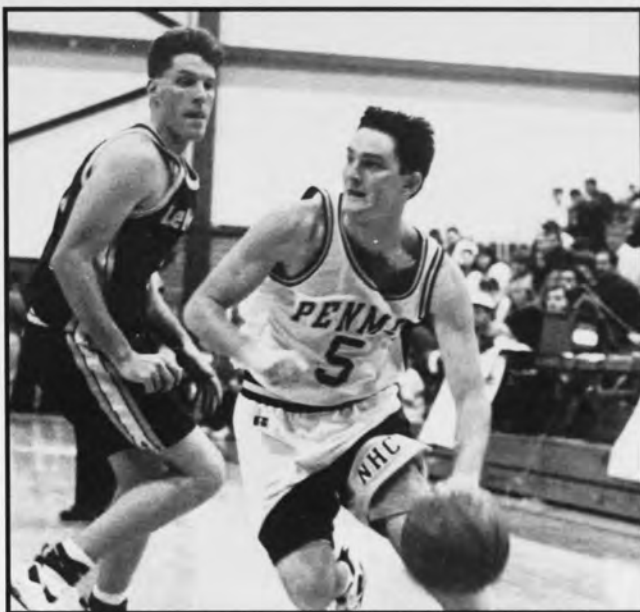

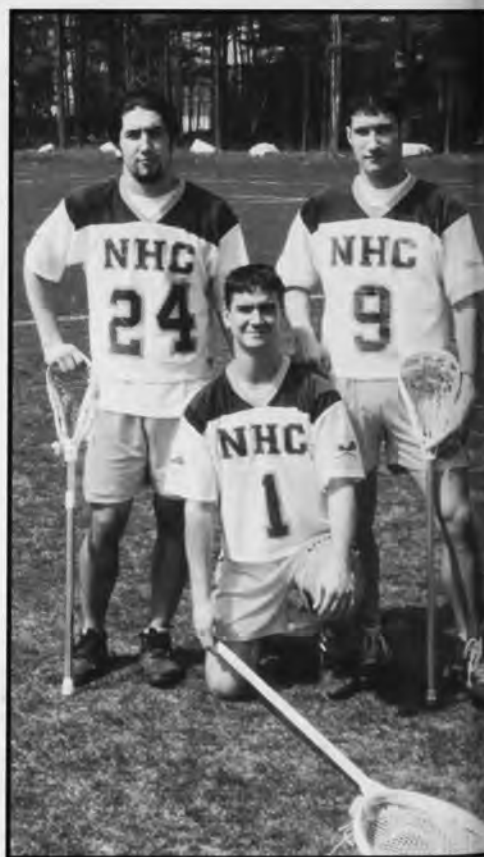

Season Review

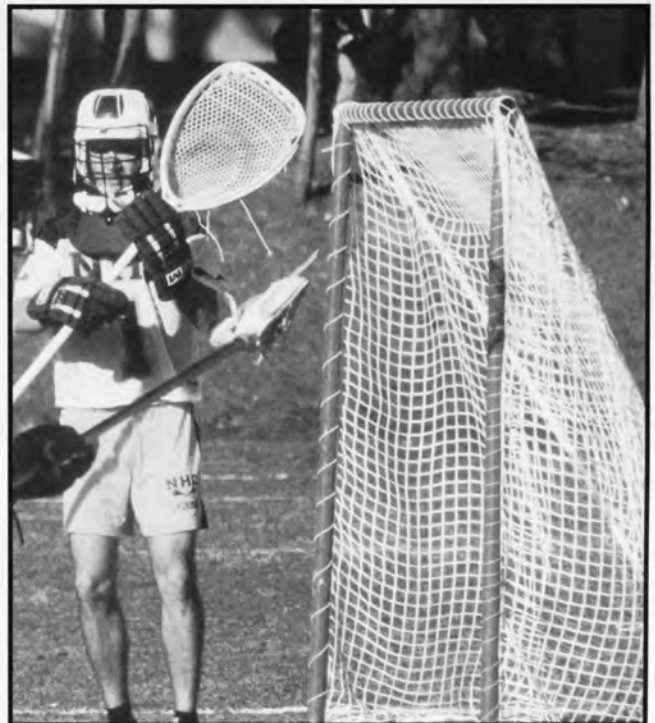
The New Hampshire College lacrosse team capped off the 1996 season on a high note, posting a 13-9 victory over Saint Michael's College on April 29. Playing with just five players who possessed more than one year of varsity experience, the Penmen won three of their final six games and closed out the year with a 5-7 record. Highlights of the season included a 20-9 victory over Saint Anselm College, a 24-8 victory over the University of New Haven and a hard-fought 10-7 loss to rival New England College. Junior Chuck Monturio, sophomore Butch Howie and Senior Nick Marino accounted for 96 of the team's 124 goals.

Marino enjoyed the most productive season of his four-year career, ranking second on the team in goals and assists and third in total points. 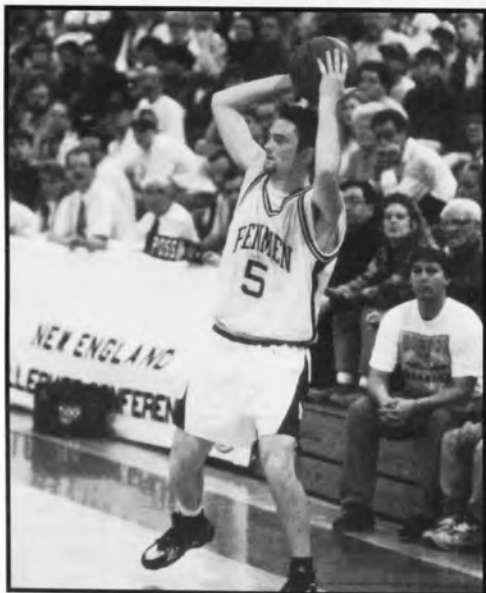

Season Review

The women's soccer team posted a 15-3 record and made its second-straight appearance in the ECAC Division II Tournament championship game. A second-straight title was not to be thought, as rival St. Anselm College upset the top-seeded Penwomen, 2-0, in the championship game at Penmen Field. Season Review

The men's soccer team finished the regular season with a 16-3-0 record and earned a bid to the 12-team NCAA division II Tournament. The Penmen's last appearance came in 1992, when they advanced to the national quarterfinals before suffering a 3-1 loss to eventual national champion Southern Connecticut State. The Penmen were seeded third in the Northeast Region behind top-seeded Franklin Pierce College and second-seeded Southern Connecticut. The post-season would

be short-lived though, as once again rival Southern Connecticut would bring the season to an end.

"I am very proud of the way the team played," said head coach John Rootes following the game. "It is unfortunate that it had to be decided on a penalty kick."

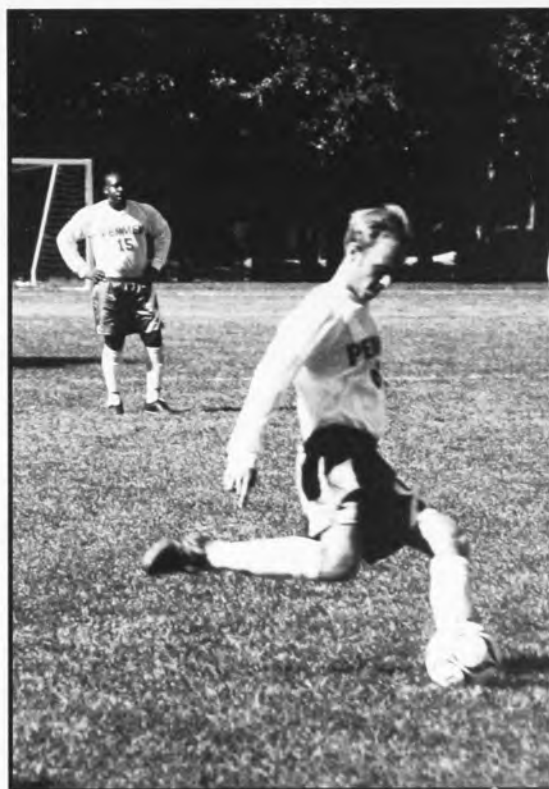

pressive seasons, while freshman Tammy Lambrou, Jaime Mechachonis and Karen Waterhouse all showed marked improvement throughout the year.

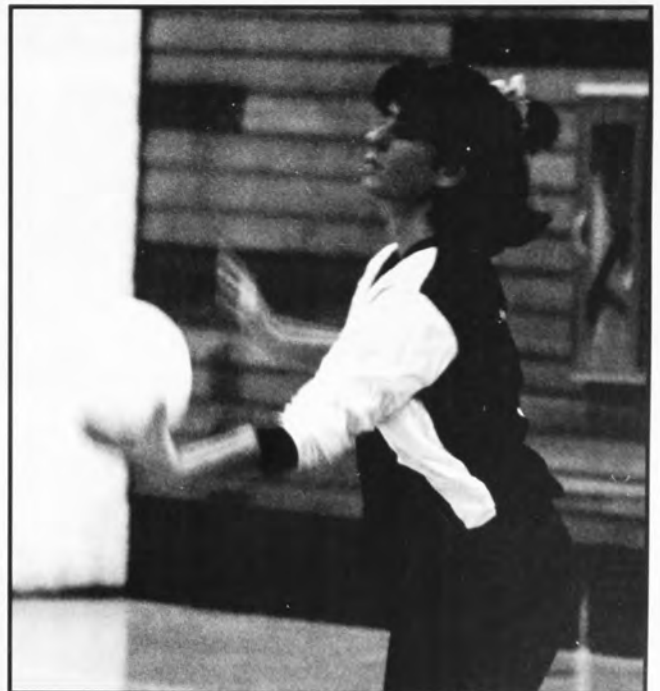
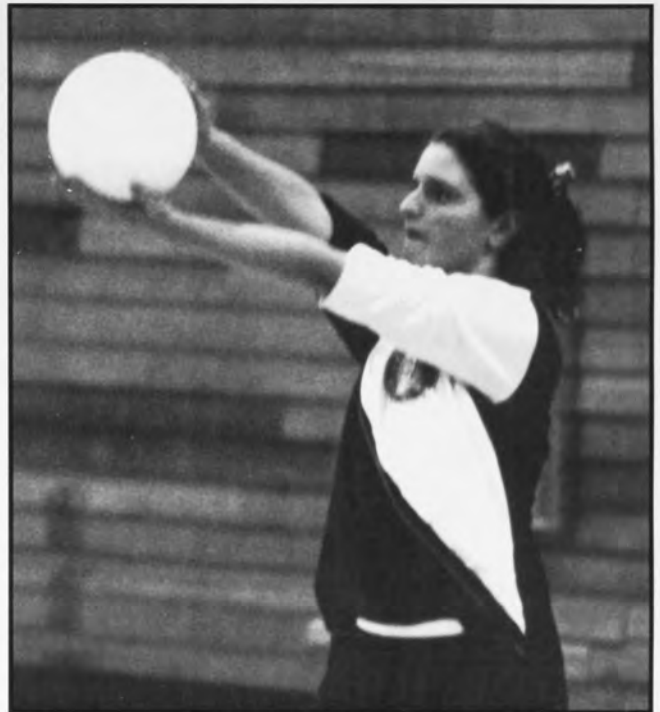

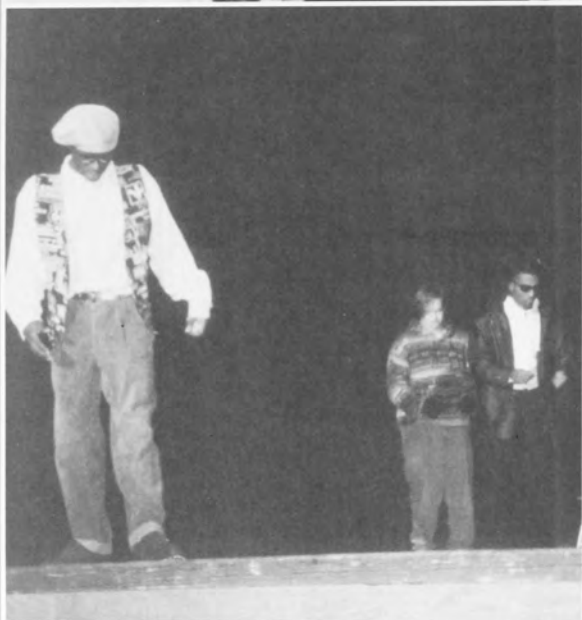












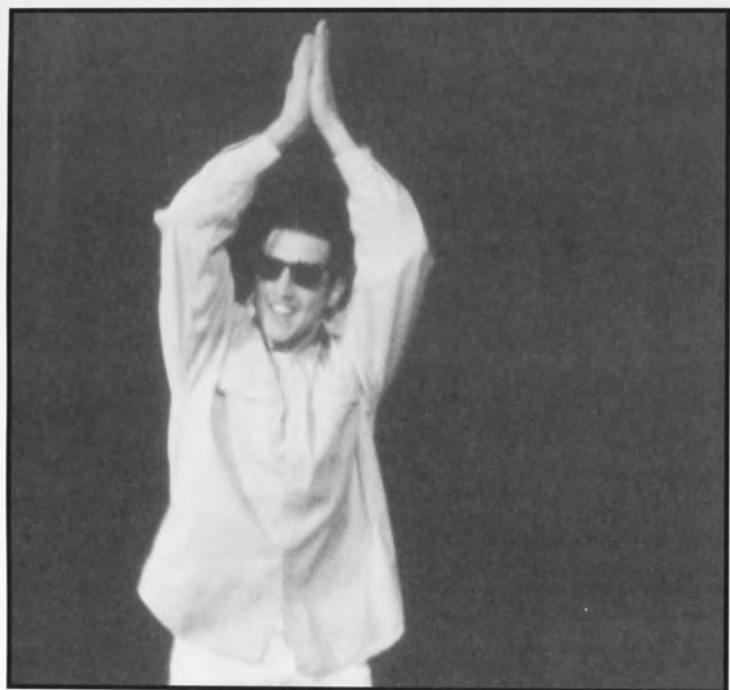


ACTIVITIES

The government shuts down for six days in November after the President and Congress fail to agree on how to balance the federal budget. The shutdown affects non-essential federal services, including the National Park Service. A longer shutdown follows in December.

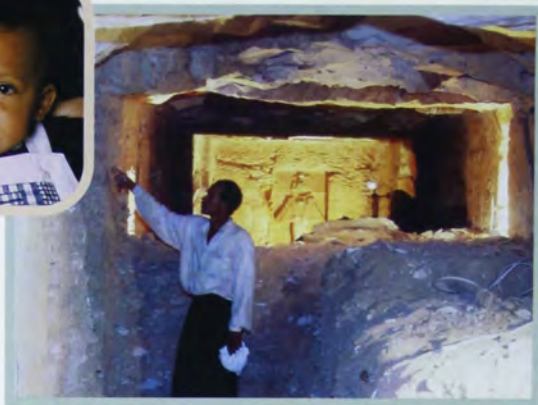
