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Learning Center Usage: Sept. 2009 - Sept. 2011

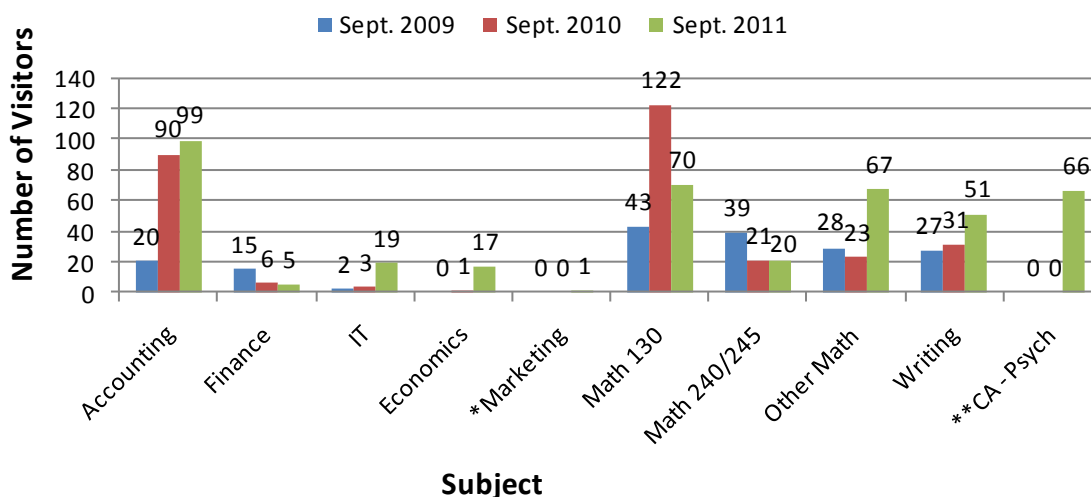
The Following charts represent a comparison of Learning Center usage in September 2009, 2010, and 2011. The increased attendance in Other Math courses for both of the

walk-in tutoring charts reflect students having a choice for their first math course. The decrease in Math 130 attendance is a result of the fewer sections offered due to this change

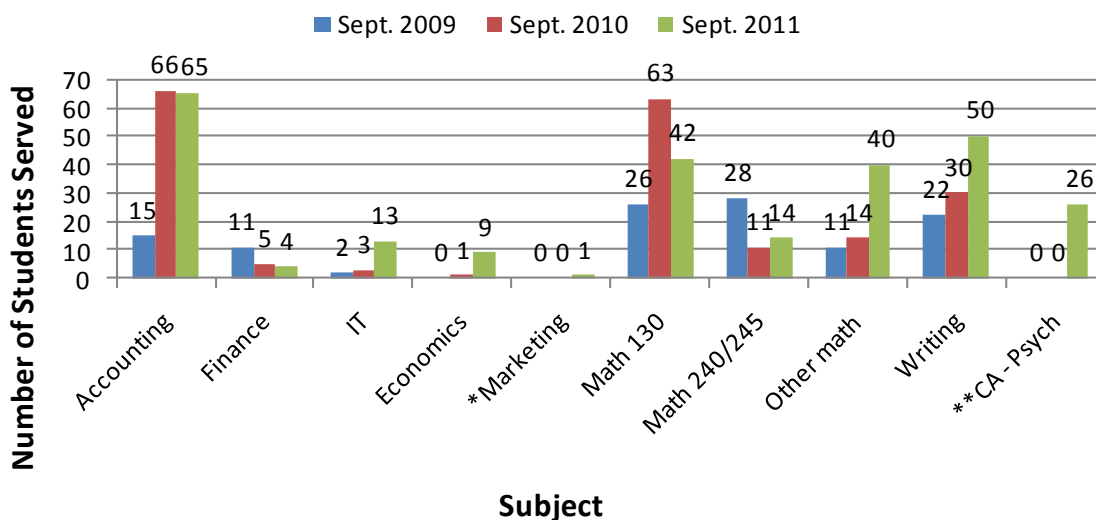
as 16 sections were offered in Fall 2011 with 25 sections offered in Fall 2010. Peer mentoring has maintained a steady increase over the

Walk-in Tutoring: Students Served



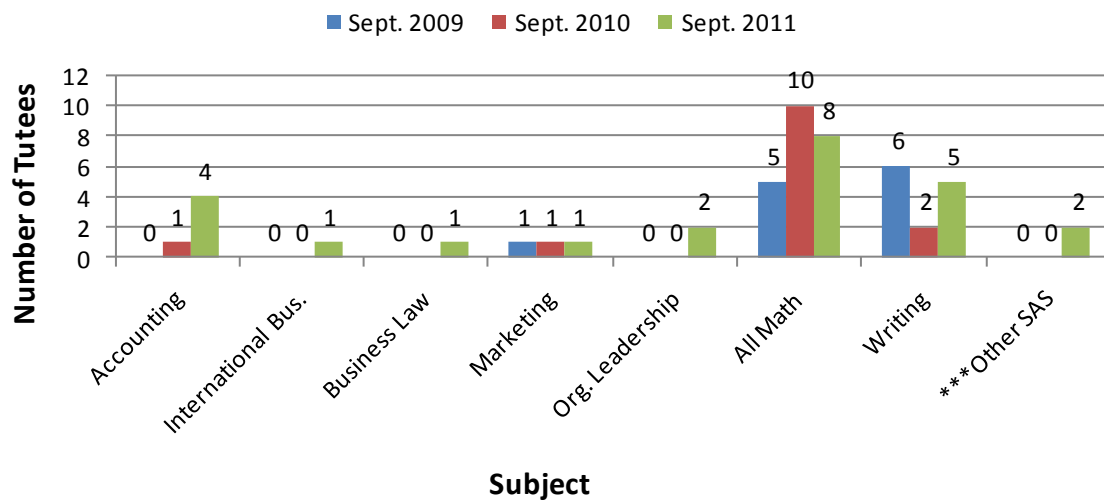
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past three years in both students served and the number of visits. Writing has also experienced an increase in regards to the number of visits and stu-

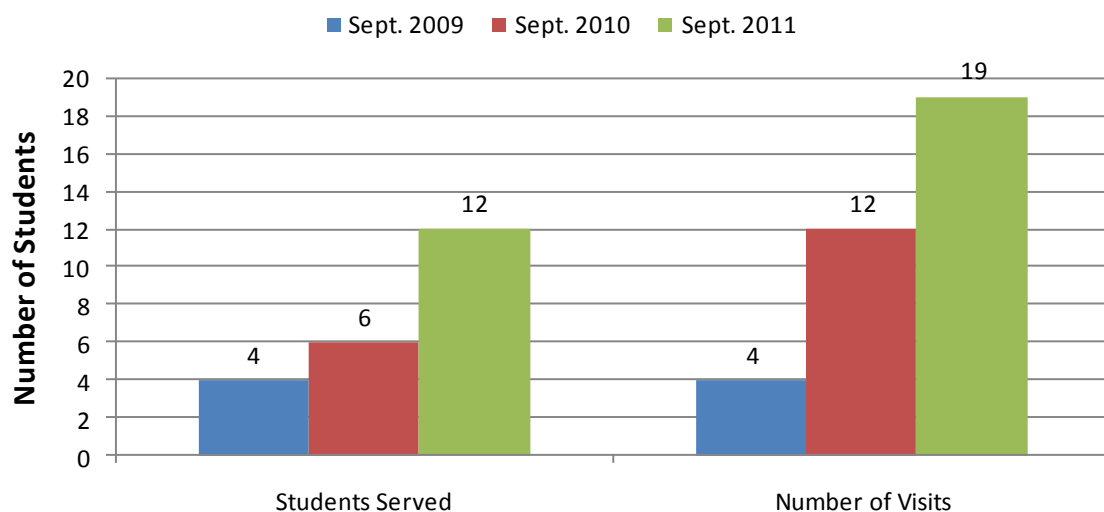

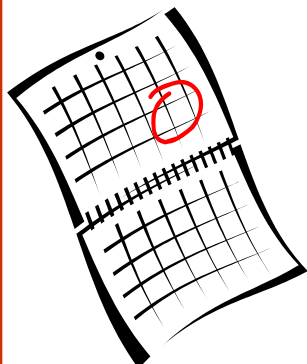
