Welcome to New England Circle

This evening's discussion is led by the Executive Committee that oversees The Citizens Transition Project, MARK GREEN (chair), HARVEY GANTT and GOVERNOR MADELEINE KUNIN who will also act as moderator.

The CTP has gathered advocates, scholars and administrators from around the country to draft a blueprint for the 1993 transition to be given the president-elect and Congress. This blueprint, in the form of a book entitled Changing America: Blueprints for a New Democracy, is comprised of 62 agency or issue-based monographs on how Washington can change, administratively and legislatively, and how to bring management and leadership skills to the business of governance.

Grounded in the values of democracy - participation, accountability and respect for the law - Changing America covers nine broad topics: economic policy, international affairs, justice, social, regulatory, and environmental policies, the presidential personnel process, race and class and campaign finance reform.

Within the broad topics separate monographs cover such issues as: tax policy; the new global marketplace; the FBI and criminal division, civil rights and EEOC; reproductive rights; consumer product safety; population and environmental protection.

Tonight's program welcomes innovative thoughts and ideas on how to bring about constructive change in America. We are pleased to offer you the opportunity to make what you say count.

New England Circle invites men and women of different cultures, political persuasions and professions to exchange ideas and opinions. The Circle evolved out of a 19th-century tradition called the Saturday Club, a group of concerned individuals such as Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow and James Russell Lowell who gathered monthly at the Parker House for lively, informal discussions.
