NEW HAMPSHIRE COLLEGE:

A FIFTY YEAR RETROSPECTIVE

New Hampshire College, in its fiftieth year, is considered one of the finest small business schools in New England. How did it get to this position, though? Who was responsible for starting this business school? New Hampshire College is the result of the efforts of many people; here we will examine a very brief outline of the history of New Hampshire College.

New Hampshire College, which is known for its good accounting program, was the idea and dream of an accountant, Mr. Harry A.B. Shapiro. Mr. Shapiro realized that many bookkeepers knew how to keep books but rarely knew why they were kept in such a manner. So, on September 12, 1932, at 8 p.m., the New Hampshire School of Accounting and Secretarial Science had its formal opening at 88 Hanover Street. The student body numbered nine in day classes and thirty-five in the evening.

However, 1932 held another important event for Mr. Shapiro. In June of 1932, Mr. Shapiro was wed to Gertrude Crockett of Stonington, Maine. Mrs. Shapiro, in the early years, did not take an active role in the school, but did help when she could.

Mr. Shapiro had a partner in the beginning of operations, Mr. Joseph Moore. Mr. Moore was bought out within a year. Mr. William W. Lee was an aid in the recruitment of students. The teachers were usually experienced in business as well as college educated.

The school enjoyed a healthy reputation as placement of graduates was nearly 100 percent. During the years of World War II, the school held a certain viewpoint towards a business experience. The following was included in a Christmas greeting sent to students in 1940:

As we look ahead to 1941, and to the years to follow, let's take a long-range viewpoint. During the present rearmament boom, perhaps some of your friends may temporarily earn more money in industrial jobs. But you are preparing for a permanent future--for a **key position** which will not end when the National Defense "boom" is over. . . . You should be able to retain your position and advance, when others are being laid off.

One of the major public relations projects was the annual commencement. The speakers were usually prominent people of government or education. In 1948, William Loeb, publisher of the Manchester Union Leader was the speaker.

Emphasis was placed on preparation for employment, however, extra-curricular activities did develop. In 1939, a student paper, *Around School*, was started by Patricia Jewett. Baseball and basketball were the first teams to represent the school.

In 1952, the institution celebrated its twentieth anniversary and unfortunately in September of that same year, Mr. Harry A.B. Shapiro passed away.

Mrs. Shapiro took over running the school in September of 1952.

In 1954, Mr. Ray Valliere took to organizing the first basketball team of the school. There were five students and three non-students on the team. The team played in the Y.M.C.A. city league and were chauffeured in a 1929 ten passenger Cadillac (with young Edward Shapiro as driver many times).

In 1960, the word "college" was added to the name of the school--New Hampshire College of Accounting and Commerce. The school was incorporated in August of the same year.

In 1963, the administration of the college decided that it was ready to grant degrees. A bill was authorized to allow the college to confer "the degrees of Bachelor of Business Science, Bachelor of Science, and Associate in Science . . ."

The college grew, and by 1967, occupied a large proportion of the commercial property on the block of Hanover Street between Elm and Chestnut.

During the unrest of the Vietnam Era, a publication appeared at the school named, **The Collegiate Revolution**. The paper printed gripes of students. In 1968, a student wrote to complain about rising tuition costs to justify grounds improvement when there was little improvement noticeable. In April 1968, the Shapiro's, Dean Beane and a Committee for Concerned Students met to discuss the situation.

The school was going non-profit and now a direct access line was to be brought between students and administration.

In July 1970, construction of the North River Road Campus began. On November 5, **The Collegiate Revolution** reported that the project was about 20 percent completed.

Also in 1970, tenure was granted to Mary P. Brown, Irving Rothman, George Teloian, Dorothy Rogers and Jean Silver. These teachers are still with us.

On July 1, 1971, Mr. Edward Shapiro was made President of the College as Mrs. Shapiro retired from the position. In September of the same year, the new campus was opened for use for the first time. When the campus opened, it consisted of a combination classroom-administration building, a classroom building, a gymnasium, and a library. For housing and feeding students were two dormitories and a cafeteria.

Expansion need was recognized immediately and on January 7, 1972, plans for four new dormitories and an addition to the student center were accepted.

The year 1975 saw expansion of athletic fields; a baseball field, two intermural football fields, and four lighted tennis courts.

Also in 1975 and 1976 three townhouse-type buildings were added to the campus. In 1977, three apartment buildings were added to the campus. In November of 1977, there was a stage built in the gym. In March of 1978, two more townhouse-type buildings were built. In May of the same year, the go ahead was given for expansion of the gym and recreational facilities.

The latest addition to the school was the purchase/leasing of the North Campus. The split campus has presented some problems but presented a very good way to help the housing problem of the school be alleviated.

New Hampshire College has grown from a student body of about thirty-five to about 1700. It has moved from one building in downtown Manchester to a split, two-campus college, in the more country areas of Manchester and Hooksett.

The future of New Hampshire College begins today with your reading this; for you will help to build its future.

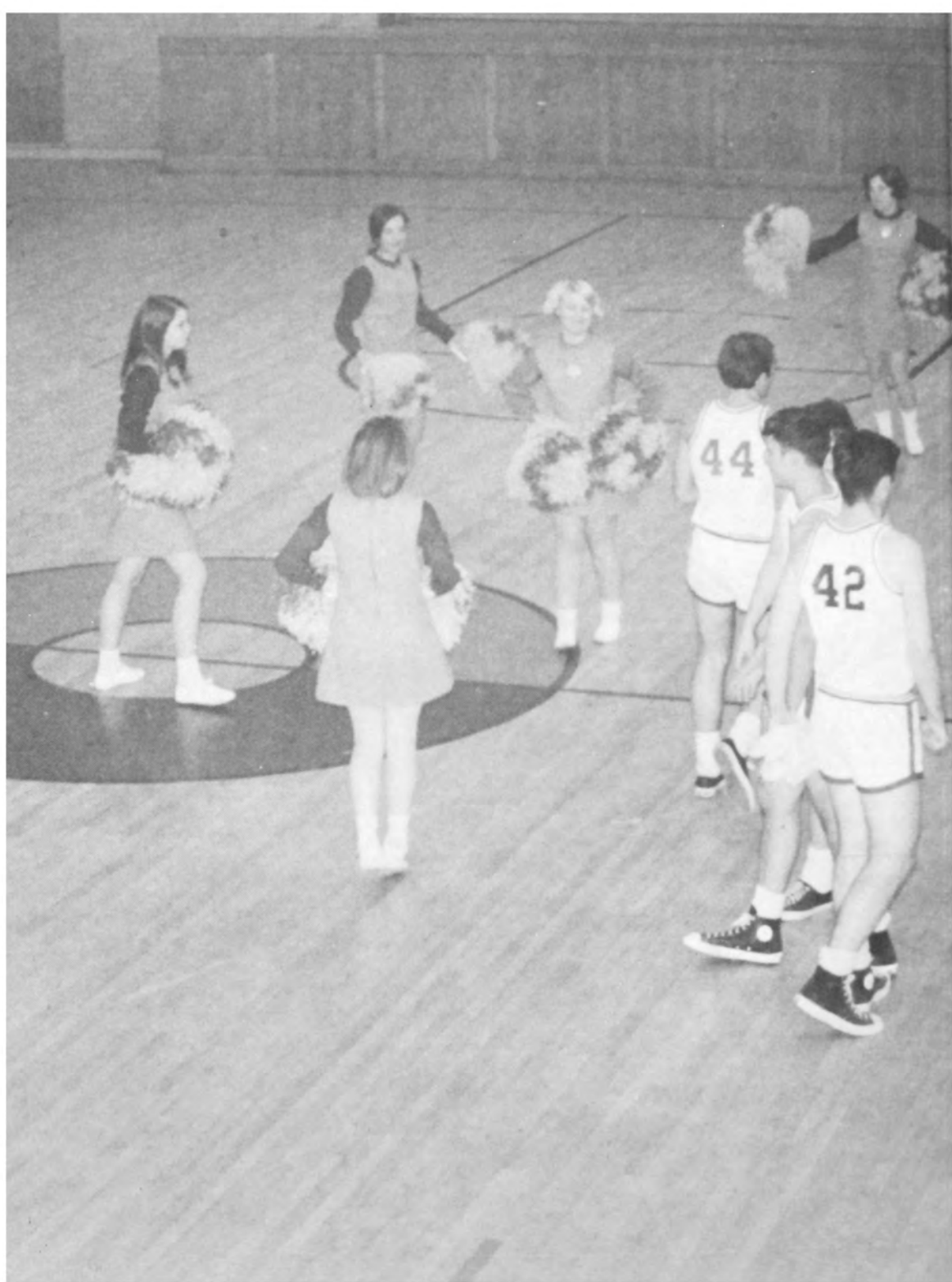
