ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

Daniel Martin of Derby Line, VT and Diane Muratore of Wayne, NJ, were named the Male and Female Athletics of the Year at New Hampshire College during the 14th Annual Sports Award Banquet.

Martin, a junior marketing major, was a center fullback scorer on the soccer team and was also the leading scorer of the hockey team at right wing. Muratore was the only female member of the ski team and was a letter winner on field hockey and softball as well. A freshman, she is majoring in general management.

The Scholar-Athlete Awards, which are presented for combined athletic excellence and academic achievement, went to Richard Ronan of Toms River, NJ and Maureen Coughlin of Wellesley, MA. Ronan is a sophomore President's List student majoring in Management Information Systems and co-captain of the baseball team. Coughlin, a sophomore who was elected co-captain of the field hockey, basketball and softball teams, is a Dean's List student in the college's Hotel/Resort/Tourism Administration program.

Sharon Fowler and Richard Pratte were named winners of the Sportsmanship Awards, selected by the college's coaching staff. Fowler, of Succasanna, NJ received letters in four sports, including field hockey, basketball, volleyball, and softball. She is a second-year student majoring in Fashion Merchandising. Pratte a junior from West Springfield, MA, was co-captain of the Ski Team and a member of the soccer team. He is a Management Information Systems major.

The Penmen booters ended a frustrating season on a bright note as they defeated Johnson State 3-1 their last game. NHC came on strong at the end of the season, including three victories out of the last four games. During this span of games, the Penmen outscored their rivals 15-4. The late-season surge brought the over-all record to 5-12. The record would be discouraging unless put into perspective. Only four starters from the first game of the season were still in the line up at the end of the season. An assortment of injuries, including two broken wrists, three ligament tears in the ankle, and a broken foot, took their toll of key players. Five freshmen and two sophomores started the bulk of the games and have gained valuable experience. Thus, there is optimism for next year.

Several players deserve special mention. Co-captain, Tim O'Neil, was an inspiration to the younger players with his hustle and gutty play. Tim, with his speed and strong left foot, stopped many an opponent threat from his wing fullback position. Indeed, Tim was voted Most Valuable Player for 1978 by his teammates. Dan "Pit" Martin and Dan Squires — two juniors from Vermont were consistent and rugged performers at the other two fullback spots. Martin has the ability to become the best-ever defender in the NHC soccer history. In goal, frosh Ernie Tyler of Enfield, NH was improving every game until suffering a broken wrist in the Plymouth State game. Greg Campbell, a sophomore from Walpole, NH finished the season in goal with a flourish as he allowed but one goal per game in the last four games. At midfield, frosh Marc Demencuk became a starter midway through the season and scored two goals to go along with an assist. Marc showed great potential. On offense, frosh Mike Erbe of Spring Lake, NJ was the leading scorer with six goals and five assists. Soph Herb Weinbaum of Framingham, MA, followed closely with eight goals and two assists. Two other freshmen, George Moutsoulis and Andrew Scarlotos came on strong. George was third leading scorer with three goals and four assists, while Andy chipped in with two goals and two assists. Co-captain Lee D'Addario of Holyoke, MA missed ten games with a fractured foot yet still contributed three goals and an assist.

With the added experience gained by the young players and with a reasonable amount of good fortune, the Penmen booters should enjoy an improved record next season.

In their second year of competition, the New Hampshire College women compiled an impressive 7-2-1 record.

The young forward line showed good scoring strength outscoring the opposition 54 goals to 16. High scorers were freshmen Laura Volpe (17 goals, 2 assists), Debbie Enright (10 goals, 8 assists), Janet Rutter (6 goals, 6 assists), and Luanne Funari (11 goals).

The defense was anchored by sophomore co-captain Maureen Coughlin and freshman Diane Muartore. From her center back position Muratore coordinated the play and tallied 4 assists.

In goal for her first year and turning in a stellar performance with her aggressive movement was co-captain Maryann Gauthier.

With this team comprised of 11 freshmen and only four upperclassmen, the '79 season looks promising.
