Congratulations to Professor Christina Clamp on the publication of an article in the September 2013 issue of *The International Journal of Co-operative Management*.

The article is entitled "Bringing Residents to the Table: the Feasibility of Co-operative Governance in Rural Low Income Housing in the USA" by Terry Lewis, Christina A. Clamp, and Eric L. Jacobs (formerly of SNHU). This special issue featured articles reporting on new empirical research as well as theoretical contributions dealing with topics of how housing co-operatives are governed internally and their external governance capacity.
