Dean George J. Larkin, Jr. announces that 2 Manchester clergymen have graciously volunteered their services as chaplains to the New Hampshire College community. They are: Rabbi Arthur Starr of Adath Yeshurun Temple, who will be on campus Wednesdays from 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m., and Reverend Florent Bilodeau, who serves as the fulltime chaplain at Notre Dame College. He will have office hours from 12:00 noon - 2:00 p.m. every Monday afternoon. Father Bilodeau has been a campus visitor on a regular basis for some time.
