MILC

The Manchester Interlibrary Cooperative, a consortium of all libraries in the greater Manchester area, has established a learning resources center with its initial thrust being the assemblage of a collection of 900 cassettes, all of which are available on loan to faculty and students of member institutions.

A large percentage of these cassettes are slanted toward an adult or college-age audience and cover a wide range of subjects: the arts, biography, history, social sciences, literature, sports, philosophy, education, religion, science, psychology and the theatre. An alphabetical list and subject list are available at the reference desk. Mrs. Jordan is the college representative to MILC and assisted in compiling the original purchase list.

Because of a contribution to matching funds last year, NHC Library has already acquired fifty free cassettes, which are in the process of being catalogued. It is possible to have many more duplicated, if we furnish the blank cassettes and the requests. In the meantime, the MILC cassettes may be charged out three days and are renewable. The college library requests them from the resource center. If you feel after listening to a cassette, that a copy should be in our library, a cassette copy can be made. The present MILC tape collection is not restricted by copyright coverage.

MILC has also compiled a union list of all periodicals received by the libraries in the consortium. NHC Library has two computerized print-outs.

Continued operation of MILC, which was started as a demonstration project in library cooperation, will be dependent on money raised by the membership itself. An equitable formula for membership and service fees for the future is being formulated. The support of the community is highly desirable and to this end, a group known as the Friends of the Manchester Interlibrary Cooperative will be formed. Mayor Sylvio Dupuis has consented to be Honorary Chairman. Anyone wishing to support MILC may purchase a Friends of the Manchester Interlibrary Cooperative membership card for 50¢ from Mrs. Lutz at the Reference Desk in the college library.

May I add: we are not likely to outgrow our need for MILC! -- Bea Jordan, Librarian

HUNZEKER SPEAKS

Assistant Professor William Hunzeker was invited to be guest speaker at a recent breakfast meeting of the Downtown Manchester Association. He summarized the high points of last summer's Student Originated Study conducted in the Manchester area. Senior Mary Dubois, a MIS major who graduated in January, headed up the study. Hunzeker served as faculty advisor to Mary and the 15 student research assistants who came from New Hampshire College and other New England and New York state colleges and universities. He reported to the DMA members on the origin of the "Study of Attitudes of Resistance to Urban Change", and the winning of the National Science Foundation award. Hunzeker also mentioned the spirit of cooperation which existed between the surveyed citizens, Manchester public officials and members of the Downtown Manchester Association. He felt that this cooperative spirit accounted in great part for the success of the survey. Hunzeker stated that some of the statistical findings of the study are proving timely and of contemporary value during the current Manchester bus crisis. He was introduced to the DMA meeting by the organization's president, Gerry Carmen.
