## KAARLO TUOMI AT NHC

On Thursday, February 21 at 8 p.m., NHC will present Mr. Kaarlo Tuomi - the only Soviet American ex-secret Double Agent appearing in public in the U. S. and Canada. Mr. Tuomi's lecture topic is "Diary of a Secret Agent of the Two World Super Powers."

A full-fledged native born U. S. citizen, Mr. Tuomi has lived in the Soviet Union for 25 years and is a graduate of the teachers' college in Kirov, Russia. Recruited into the KGB (Soviet Secret Service) in the late 40's, Kaarlo was sent to the United States in 1958 to act as a spy. In March of 1959, the FBI contacted him, and after many conversations, Kaarlo decided in favor of the United States and became a double agent for the FBI.

His life story in condensed form appeared in the April 1970 issue of Reader's Digest under "The Schooling of a Soviet Spy" and the May issue under "The Spy Who Changed His Mind." His story is also featured in John Barron's "K.G.B.," recently released.
