
I have been at New Hampshire College for eleven years. During that eleven year period, a syndrome has grown among the student body that basketball is the only concern of the Athletic Department, and that basketball receives an enormous amount of funding from the college.

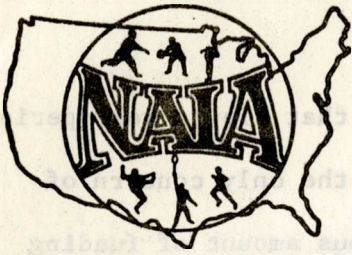
This is an outright misconception, and must be eliminated if the basketball program at New Hampshire College is to continue to improve as it has in the past. I might add that the entire athletic department is hurt by this pettiness which seems to exist in the student body.

The basketball budget for the current academic year is open to inspection by any member of the student body. The 1973-74 basketball budget is \$3,378.00. This does not include the scholarship aid given to basketball players. Basketball is the only sport to receive scholarship aid. As the Athletic Director, this policy is a correct one, and I will debate it with anyone at anytime. I believe the basketball record speaks for itself - the quality speaks for itself, and the purpose of the program, which is to promote our school, is being achieved.

I welcome the opportunity to discuss this with anyone. I am very tired of seeing the basketball program kicked around, and the players the recipients of undue criticism. If any criticism is levelled, it should be levelled at me, Louis D'Allesandro, the Athletic Director and Head Basketball Coach. I assume complete responsibility for the development of the entire athletic program.

May I further state that New Hampshire College has one of the finest overall athletic programs of any college in the entire New England area. We support inter-collegiate competition in many areas, and have in the past years added additional financial burdens to the athletic budget by increasing inter-collegiate athletic activities in order to provide our student body with a well rounded athletic program.
