Motion: The SGA will allow Phi Psi to hold their second function on February 14. (The first being the Halloween party which was also held on a week day.)
Vote: Unanimous.

Snow Sculptures: Nick Brattan suggested that we have a snow sculpture contest beginning around February 8 and having the sculptures judged during Winter Weekend. He also hoped to have snow shoeing, skating, a shuttle service to McIntyre, etc. Nick asked for \$500 to cover the expenses of the prizes.

Motion: To set aside \$500 for the contest pending approval by the Budget Committee.
Vote Unanimous.

National Entertainment Conference in Houston: Brian Gorden would like Dave Bernasconi to accompany him to Houston for the conference. The purpose of this trip is to try to secure a well-known group for Spring Weekend at a very low rate. Brian estimated that \$350 would be needed for Dave's trip.
