Things are really beginning to happen in Washington, and this office is getting nervous!!

"THE BILL" S2789, was reported out of the Education and Training Subcommittee, and is now in the hands of the Veterans Affairs Subcommittee on Education and Training. The Chairman, Cong. Henry Helstoski (D-N.J.) is on OUR SIDE!!

The "guts" of "THE BILL" are as follows:

1. Increase the educational assistance allowances under all veterans programs by 13.6%
2. Increase the period of completing education from 8 to 10 years.
3. Cost of Living Increases each year according to Bureau of Labor Statistics (for educational benefits and pension checks)
4. Reduce disability requirement for VOC-REHAB from 30% min. to 10% min.
5. Establish VA Communication Center within the VA, made up of Viet Vets.
