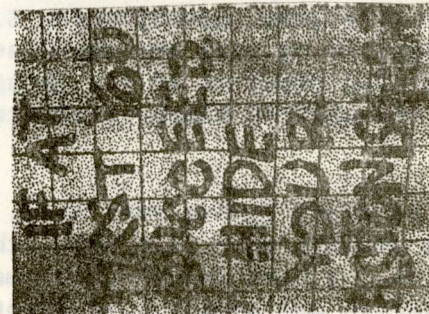

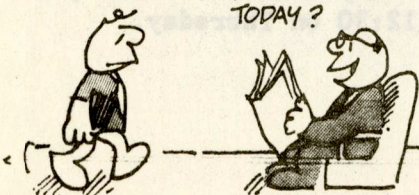
## WNHC NEEDS THEE
