## DR. JONES HONORED

The Jaycees of Manchester recently honored Dr. Michael K. Jones of New Hampshire College by naming him Manchester's Outstanding Young Man of 1973. An annual dinner at the Chateau Restaurant was the scene of presentation of a special plaque from the Manchester Junior Chamber of Commerce. Several of Dr. Jones' NHC based efforts were among current accomplishments which gave him this significant honor: his initiation of the popular Community Professor program; his work with the Management Intern program, and the pre-retirement program. He was also cited for many past activities, such as: Serving as a delegate to the White House Conference on Aging in December 1971; helping to set up a high school for Indians in the American Indian Center in Chicago; work with YMCA's in Louisville, Kentucky and Springfield, Mass.; assisting in formation of the Kentucky Association of Older People. Dr. Jones has still another honor in the offing, as he will soon be listed among Outstanding Educators of America in their 1973 edition. CONGRATULATIONS on many jobs well done!
