Ending: How can we Help


There are various factors that cause a student to reach the point of dropping out. Teachers need to be willing and able to help understand these factors and aid the student to success.


- · Harper is the oldest of 4 and she is a sophomore in High School

- Harper is thinking about dropping out of school to work so she can continue to live at home with her family


