## FOREIGN SERVICE VISITOR

Charles Freeman, a career foreign service officer and Country Director for the People's Republic of China in the U.S. Department of State, will be on campus Wednesday, February 27 to visit with students and staff. Mr. Freeman, a specialist on Chinese political affairs, served as interpreter for then Secretary of State William Rogers during the 1972 trip of President Nixon to China.

He will speak to the Comparative Government class in Stark 13 from 10 - 11 a.m. This class will be open to the community as will an interview to be conducted in the TV studio from 1 - 2 p.m. This interview will be taped for replay over the closed circuit system. Government Instructor Ernest Holm will be escorting Mr. Freeman, and if students or staff members would like to meet with him or have him meet with groups or classes, Mr. Holm will be glad to make arrangements.
