STATING THE FACT OF ACCREDITATION

In response to several institutional requests for guidance in stating the fact of accreditation under the new name of the Association, the Executive Committee of the Commission has taken action to establish the following interim guidelines. These guidelines take effect immediately and will be considered by the full Commission at its spring meeting for ratification or amendment.

1. For general publications (catalogs, letterheads, brochures, promotional literature, etc.) institutions shall state the fact of accreditation as follows:

Accredited Member, Association of Independent Colleges and Schools,

or

Accredited by the Accrediting Commission of the Association of Independent Colleges and Schools.

2. For mass media (newspapers, magazines, radio and television) where there are time and space limitations accredited institutions may state the fact of accreditation as follows:

Accredited Member AICS,

or

Accredited by the Accrediting Commission of AICS
