FACULTY OPPOSE SGA RESOLUTION

At the faculty meeting on March 14, 1973, the faculty voted against the Student Government proposal excusing A and B students from final exams. The exact proposal of the Student Government Association was:

"All students having an A average, however computed (i.e. tests, quizzes, reports, papers, etc.), are to be excused from writing the exam and given an A for the course. All students with B averages are to be given the option to take the exam and attempt to raise the grade or to accept the B. All others will be required to take the exam."

The proposal received no "yes" votes, 22 faculty voted "no" and there were 4 abstentions.
