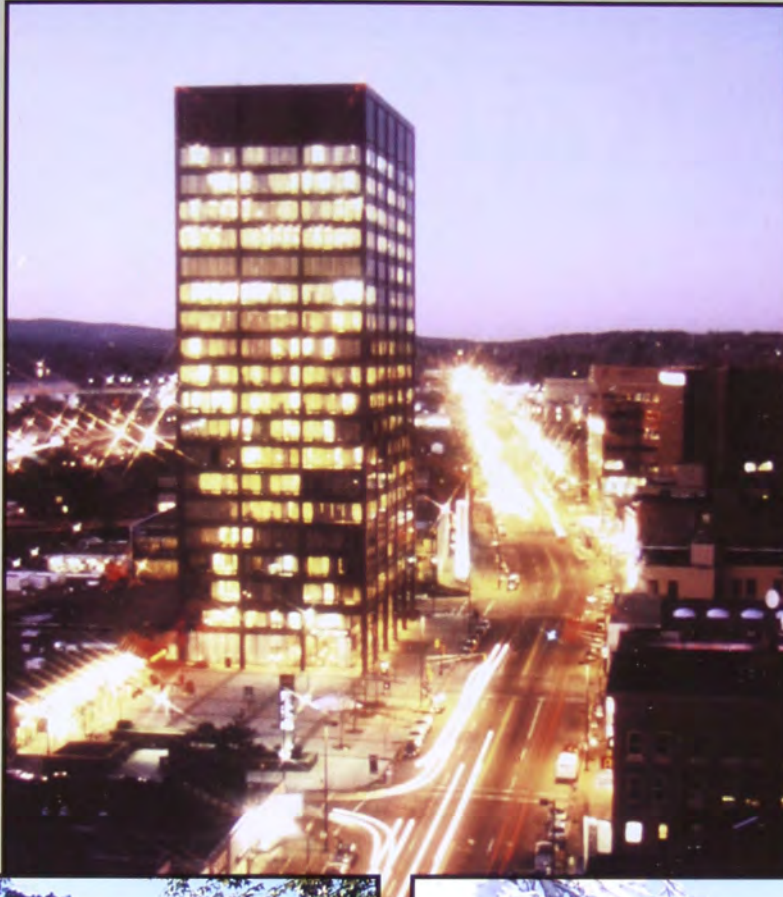

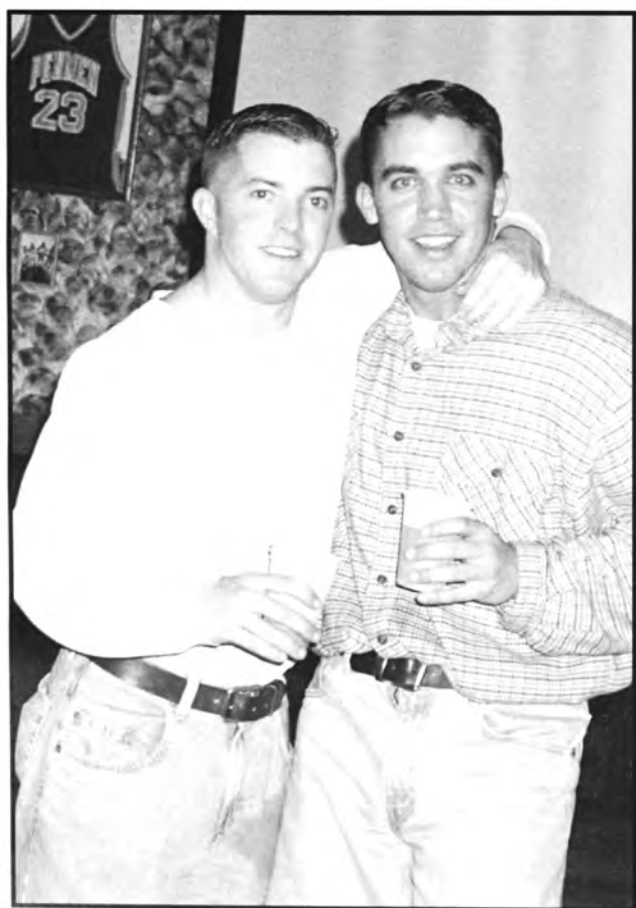


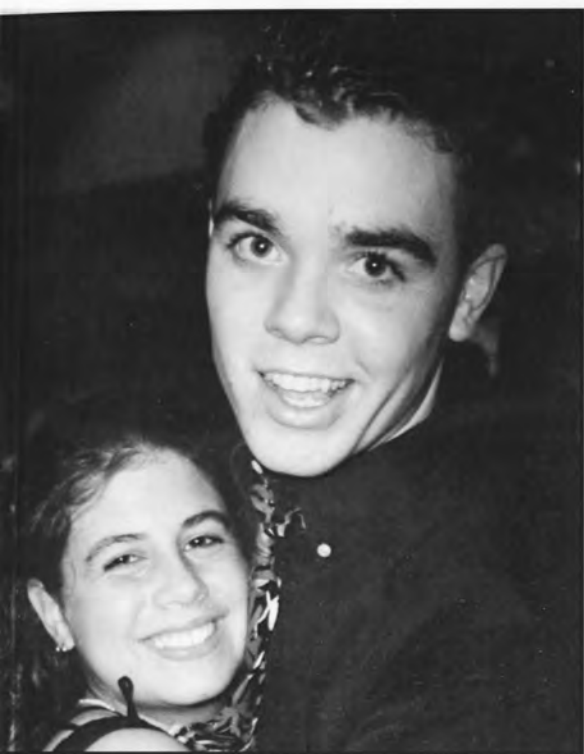

Remember the times, never forget them, even the little ones can hold the greatest meaning.....

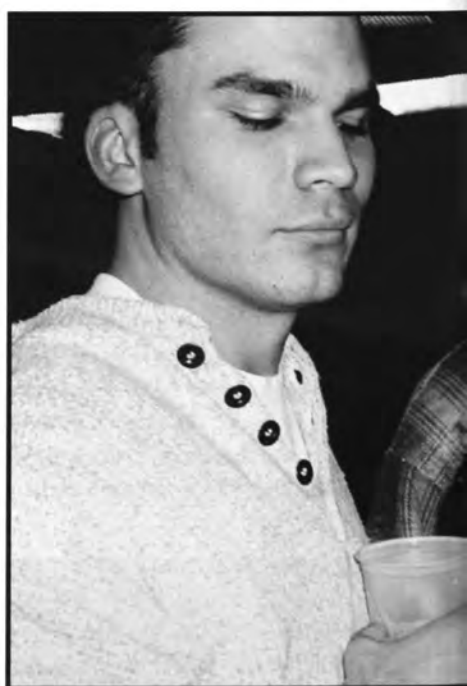

Women's Soccer



Faced with possibility of not qualifying for a post-season tournament for just the fourth time in the 15-year history of the program, the New Hampshire College women's soccer team closed out the 1996 regular season with five-straight victories to earn a berth in the ECAC Division II Tournament. The Penwomen continued their hot streak during the post-season, as they posted wins over Quinnipac College and tournament host Keene State College enroute to a seventh-straight ECAC Tournament. Closing out the year with a 13-1 record. Seeded third in the ECAC Tournament, NHC advanced to the title game for the third-straight year following a 1-0 victory over second-seeded Quinnipac. The championship game saw NHC and Keene State play 115 minutes of scoreless soccer before the hosts opened scoring just 22 seconds into overtime. NHC netted the game-winner just 2:31 later off the foot of junior Becca Dorunda. Swabowicz, along with other seniors Mary Casey, Naomi Caddel, and Jen Paige capped off their careers in fine fashion. Swabowicz led the team in scoring for her fourth-straight year and closed her career ranked second among the program's all-time leaders in career goals (61) and career points (190). Head coach Peter Tufts recorded his 200th career win following a 1-0 win over Sacred Heart and has now posted a 203-58-15 record in his 15 seasons on the sidelines.

Men's Soccer



The New Hampshire College men's soccer team entered the final two weeks of 1996 as a legitimate contender for the Division II national title. The Penmen who had gone undefeated through the first 14 games, lost two of their final three games and were not invited to the 12-team NCAA Division II tournament. Just like that their dreams of the national title were over. The two losses came on the road at the Franklin Pierce College and Dowling College. NHCC cruised through the first half of the season, outscoring its opposition 34-3 on the way to a 9-0-1 record and a No. 1 national ranking. The Penmen posted a 2-2 overtime loss with top ranked Southern Connecticut at Penmen Field before a large Alumni-Weekend crowd on Oct. 19th. NHCC headed into its showdown with rival Franklin Pierce with a 12-0-2 record. They rebounded with a 4-0 victory over Bridgeport, but then closed out the year with a 1-0 loss to Dowling in which the game winning goal came off a penalty kick. Junior Dean Sewell paced the NHC attack all season and ranked second among the NECC scoring leaders with 48 points. Seniors Jamie Williams (22pts) and Tom Dempsey (12pts) both enjoyed productive seasons, along with first year players Mats Anderson (12pts) and Matt Holmstrands (10pts). Head Coach John Rootes recorded his 150th career following a victory over Sacred Heart and has posted a 152-28-9 record in his nine years at NHC.

The New Hampshire College women's basketball team closed out the season with an 8-12 overall record and a 6-12 showing in the New England Collegiate Conference. The Penwomen's conference record was good enough for seventh place in the 10-team league and earned them a spot in the post-season NECC Tournament.

The team's post-season was short lived though, as a loss eventual NECC champion UMASS Lowell in the opening round of the league tournament brought the season to an end.

Senior Kristen Crouteau enjoyed the most productive season of her four year career, as she led the team in scoring (12.2 ppg) and averaged 6.1 rebounds per game. 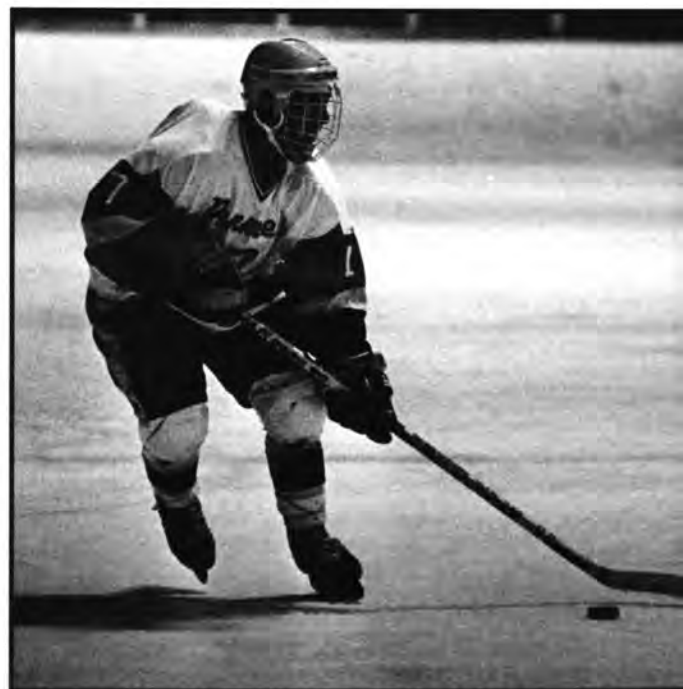

Baseball



The New Hampshire College baseball team capped off the 1997 season in fine fashion, claiming its first ever Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division II title. The Penmen posted open round wins over Concordia College (10-4) and tournament host Philadelphia Textile (7-5), and were awarded the championship when the second round action of the double-elimination tournament was cancelled due to rain. NHC was the only team in the three-team field that went unbeaten in the first round. NHC, which entered the ECAC tournament averaging just 8 hits and 5 runs a game, exploded for 32 hits and 17 runs over the 2 games. Defensively, the Penmen were just as impressive, committing just 2 errors during tournament play. Senior Steve Shea worked 8 1/3 innings in a 7-0 win over Philadelphia Textile and improved his record to 6-6. Shea and Marc Perec were cornerstones of the pitching staff all season. Perec was voted NECC Pitcher of the Year. Additional pitching support came from seniors Steve Agosti, Todd Lamothe, and freshman Lucas Adams.

Lacrosse

The New Hampshire College Lacrosse team struggled through the 1997 season, losing its first nine games and posting an overall record of 1-9. Senior Chuck Monturio's assault on the school record highlighted the season. A native of Weymouth, Mass., Monturio racked up 44 goals and 55 points and closed out the season ranked first among Division II players in goals per game. A preseason All-American selection by College Lacrosse USA, he became the first player in the program's history to record 50 points of more four-straight years. He would establish several other school records before the year was over. Monturio, who was featured in *Sports Illustrated's* Faces in the Crowd after scoring 12 goals in a win over New Haven last year, capped off his career with 150 goals, 82 assists and 232 points in just 45 career games. Senior Rich Shleif provided additional support. Shleif made the most of his first and only year with the team, netting nine goals and assisting on three others. A late season injury to senior Jason Rabinowitz took its toll. Jason Andrews, John Krause and Dave Regan came through with inspired efforts in his absence.

Softball

The New Hampshire College softball team returned to action in 1997 after having to cancel the entire 1996 season due to a lack of players. First-year head coach Colleen Kelley assembled a 14-player roster that showed signs of a promising future despite winning just one of 24 games this spring. After losing its first six games of the year, the Penwomen posted what would be their lone win of the year with a thrilling come-from-behind victory over UMass Lowell. The victory snapped a 32-game losing streak that dated back to 1994 and also marked the first career win for Kelley. NHC closed out the year with an impressive effort against rival St. Anselm College. The Penwomen nearly upset the highly favored Hawks, who took a 2-0 record into the doubleheader. In November, a hijacked Ethiopian airliner crashes after running out of fuel. The crash occurs near a resort beach in the Comoros Islands in the Indian Ocean. At least 123 of the 175 people on board die, including the hijackers.

A U.N.-negotiated treaty banning chemical weapons worldwide is set to take effect in the spring. The treaty prohibits the development, production, stockpiling or use of chemical weapons, and calls for the destruction of existing supplies. The treaty is signed by 160 nations, including the U.S.

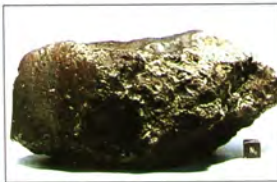

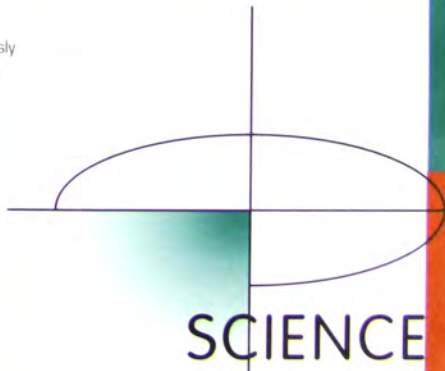

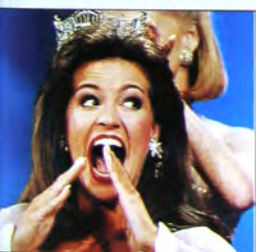

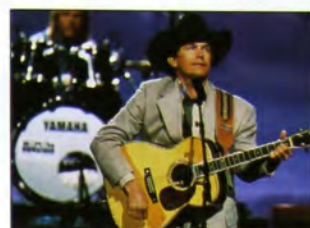
