Room 24 Stark Hall has become our temporary studio. Classes will now utilize Stark 24 for recording or program playback. All videotape recording sessions by faculty and students will now be conducted in S-24, where the camera mixing console and studio lighting will aid in much more professional productions and programs.

The 16 mm projector will be kept permanently in Stark 24. If you have a film to show, please reserve the room as much in advance as possible. I have a feeling S-24 will be used extensively this semester, so remember--RESERVE IN ADVANCE. Classes may be brought to the studio to use the opaque projector and the overhead projector, which will also be kept permanently in S-24. Seating capacity in the room is about 40.

Because of the equipment in the studio and the relatively small room, there will be absolutely no smoking and no food on the premises. Faculty members are requested to so instruct their classes prior to visits.
