BLUEGRASS AT NHC

On Saturday, February 23, NHC will present Don Reno, Bill Harrell and the Tennessee Cutups. The concert begins at 8 p.m. in the gym. The Cutups are the first and only bluegrass group aver to perform at the United Nations and a Presidential Insugural. They have also played at most of the major bluegrass festivals as well as appearing on the Grand Ole Opry.

Don Reno was voted by the readers of Bluegrass Unlimited magazine "the 1971 Banjo Player of the Year." Don, a guitarist as well as a banjo player, was the original co-recorder of "Dueling Banjos." Bill Marrell, the rhythm guitar player and lead singer, has been Don's partner since 1966. The group also includes Ferris on bass and Buck Ryan, three-time

Appearing with the Cutups is the comedy team of Edmonds and Curley. This up and coming act has appeared with Johnny Carson, Dick Cavett, Mike Douglas and other television shows as well as in night clubs throughout the W. S.
