## SMOKING OR NO SMOKING

Cigaratte Smoking: Reaction of Non-Smokers Because many smokers smoke in theaters. offices, restaurants, on planes and trains often without regard for 'No Smoking" signs many airlines and railroads are now reserving more space for non-smoking travelers. (Penn Central reports empty seats in smoking cars and standees in no-smoking cars during commuter rush hours.) Smoking is prohibited in both houses of Congress, in the Supreme Court and most federal courts, federal museums and 14 braries. Some states have started enforcing old fire-prevention laws forbidding smoking in theaters, courtrooms, buses, libraries and hospitals. Two states, Utah add Arizona, have already taken action to ban smoking in public places. In fact, some restaurants in Arizona have set up non-smoking sections; they have had positive feedback on this action. Numerous privately owned enterprises and non-governmental agencies are now posting no-smoking signs.

Non-smokers can effect the status quo in restaurants, planes, sporting arenas and such, by demanding a non-smoking area as well as demanding enforcement of rules in theaters, etc., where the rules are being neglected. For example, one jurist, when told that the no-smoking rule would be relaxed because of the lateness of the lawyers, stood up and objected. Stating that she was there because the law required her to be and she didn't want to be made miserable in the process, she got a big hand from her fellow jurists. No one lit up.

Perhaps one delegate to the United Nations
World Health Organization has stated the position of non-smokers best by saying: "Smoking
should be confined to sonsenting adults in
