DICK THORNBURGH currently serves as Director of the Institute of Politics at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government and is a partner in the Pittsburgh law firm of Kirkpatrick & Lockhart, which also has offices in Harrisburg PA, Boston, Miami, and Washington, DC. Prior to assuming his current positions, Thornburgh served two terms as Governor of Pennsylvania, elected in 1978 and re-elected in 1982. His fellow governors, in a 1986 Newsweek poll, named him as one of the nation's most effective big state governors. Before he became governor, he served as United States Attorney for Western Pennsylvania (1969-1975) and Assistant Attorney General of the United States in charge of the criminal division in Washington, DC (1975-77) during the administration of President Gerald Ford.
