PHI DELTA THETA INTERNATIONAL FRATERNITY

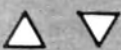

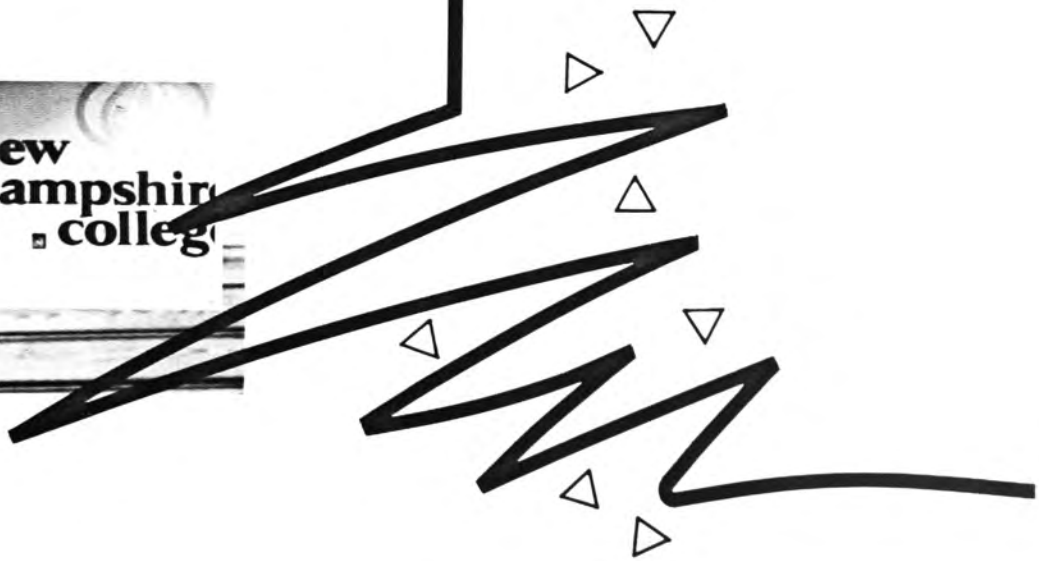

For the fifth-straight year the NHC men's soccer team participated in the NCAA Division II Championship Tournament, unfortunately a first round loss to the University of Bridgeport ended the Penmen's hopes of repeating as national champions.

NHC posted a final record of 15-7-0 and was ranked 17th in the final Division II national poll. After winning just five of their first nine contests, the Penmen rebounded to win 10 of their remaining 11 games and finish the regular

season at 15-5-0. Two straight one-goal losses to Bridgeport, first in the NECC Tournament and then in the NCAAs, would bring the season to an abrupt end.

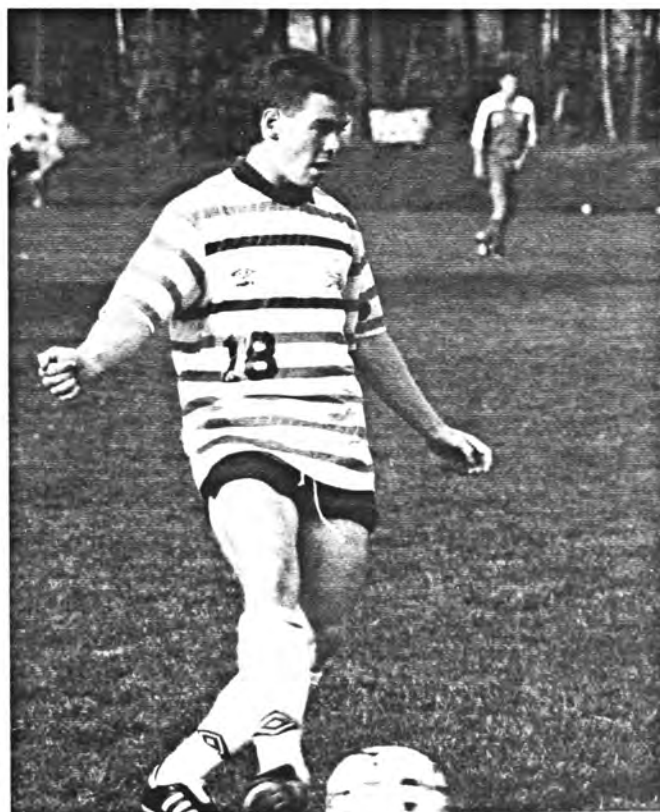
"It was a tough season," commented NHC coach John Rootes. "We had some injuries to key players and just were unable to get the big goals when we needed them."

The 1990 season saw the NHC women's soccer team outscore its opponents 54-11, compile a record of 17-3-2 and finish the year ranked No. 5 in the national Division II poll. In addition, the Lady Penmen advanced to the finals to the ECAC Championship Tournament for the third straight year. Unfortunately a third straight title was not to be, as Southampton College upset NHC for its first ever ECAC championship. 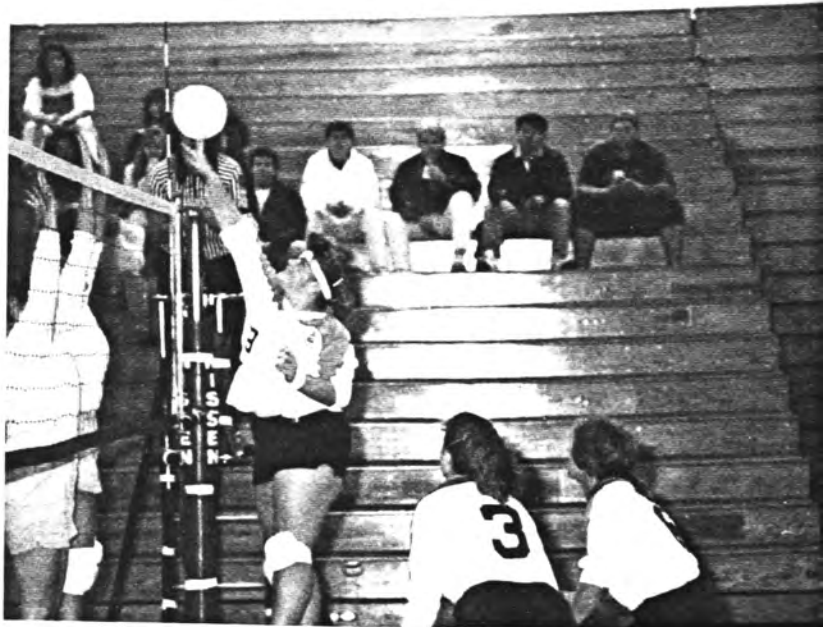

The Sideline

Although the New Hampshire College men's basketball team wasn't able to top its record breaking season of a year ago, it was able to secure a post-season bid for the second straight year with its invitation to the 1991 Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division II Championship Tournament. The Penmen advanced to the tournament championship game with a 97-89 victory over Adelphi University in the semifinals. An 82-76 loss to tournament host and defending champion Pace University in the title game denied NHC its first ever ECAC title. NHC finished the year with an overall record of 19-12 and a 7-7 mark in the New England Collegiate Conference.

Halfway through the season the Penmen had compiled a 12-3 record and appeared to be on their way to a second straight appearance in the NCAA Division II Championship Tournament. Unfortunately the Penmen managed just five victories in their final 12 regular season games, and then were knocked out of the NCAA Tournament race with an 82-68 loss to Franklin Pierce College in the semifinals of the NECC Tournament.

Highlights of the season included victories over conference rivals Franklin Pierce and Keene State in the first Day's Inn Granite State Classic, a first place showing in the Florida Atlantic University Holiday Shootout and a 90-72 decision of cross-town rival St. Anselm College.

The New Hampshire College women's basketball team capped off the 1990-91 season in fine fashion by winning its first ever Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division II Championship. NHC downed tournament host West Chester University 60-59, in the finals to claim the title.

The Lady Penmen struggled through the first half of the season, posting just seven victories in their first 15 games. After opening the season with losses in three of its first four games, NHC put

together a four-game winning streak and took first place in the NHC Holiday classic. An impressive 90-72 victory over nationally ranked Lock Haven University earned the Lady Penmen the tournament championship. The celebration was short lived though, as NHC dropped its next four games, the last of which a tough 78-57 setback at the hands of cross-town rival St. Anselm College.

An inspired come-from-behind victory over conference rival Keene State College broke the losing streak and marked the turning point of the season for NHC. The Lady Penmen went on to win 12 of their last 18 games, finish with a respectable 18-13 overall record, advance to the NECC Tournament championship game for the second straight year and capture the ECAC title.

"I was very pleased with the way the team came together and performed after losing three starters from last year's team," remarked NHC coach Nancy Dreffs. "The veterans provided a lot of leadership and the newcomers contributed a great deal and will benefit from the experience in the long run."





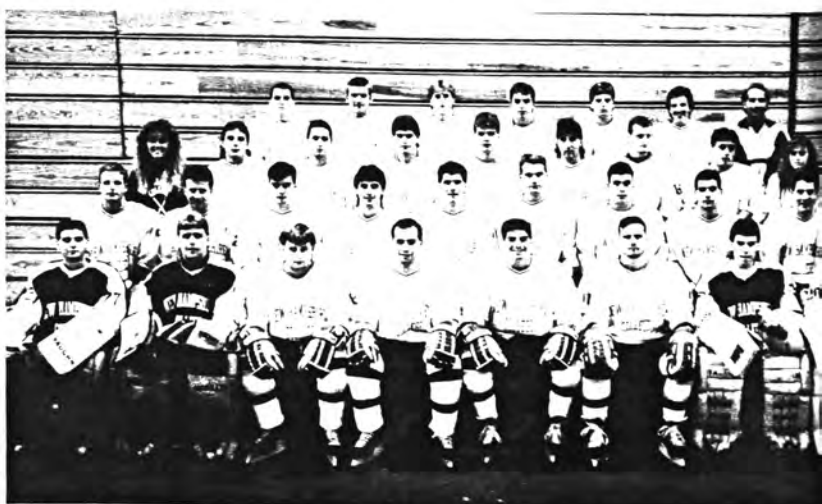

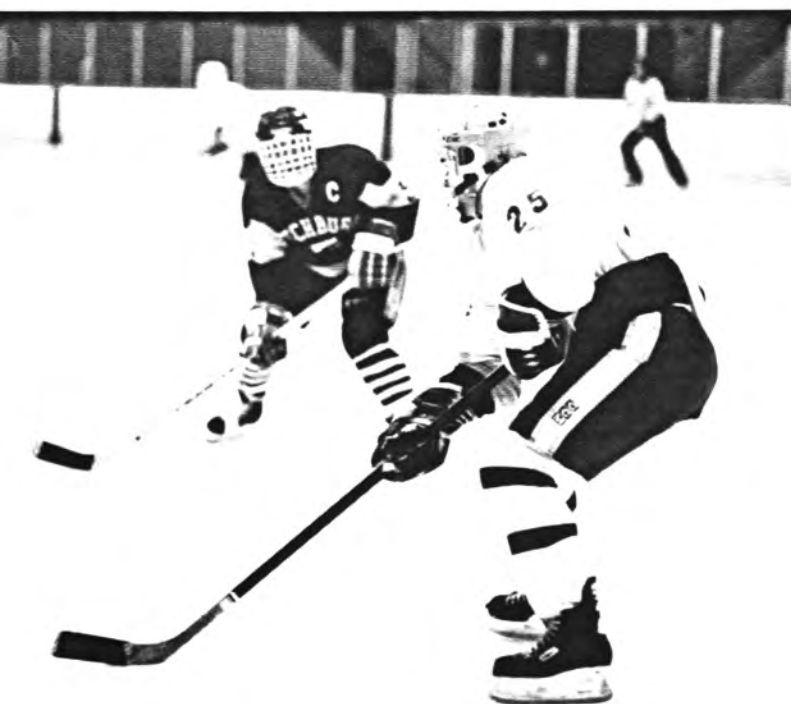
The good news is the New Hampshire College hockey team recorded its second straight winning season with a 10-7-4 overall record. The bad news is a late season slump prevented the Penmen from earning a bid to Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) playoffs.

NHC opened the season with victories over Nichols (6-3), Stonehill (4-1), Plymouth State (6-4) and St. Michael's (4-2), and finished the first half of the season undefeated with a 5-0-3 record; good enough for fourth place in the ECAC North standings.

Things continued to go the Penmen's way after the Christmas break as they won four of their six games during the month of January and owned an impressive 9-2-3 record with seven games remaining. Unfortunately, NHC went 1-5-1 in its last seven games, dropped from fifth to seventh place in the ECAC North standings and was eliminated from post-season play.

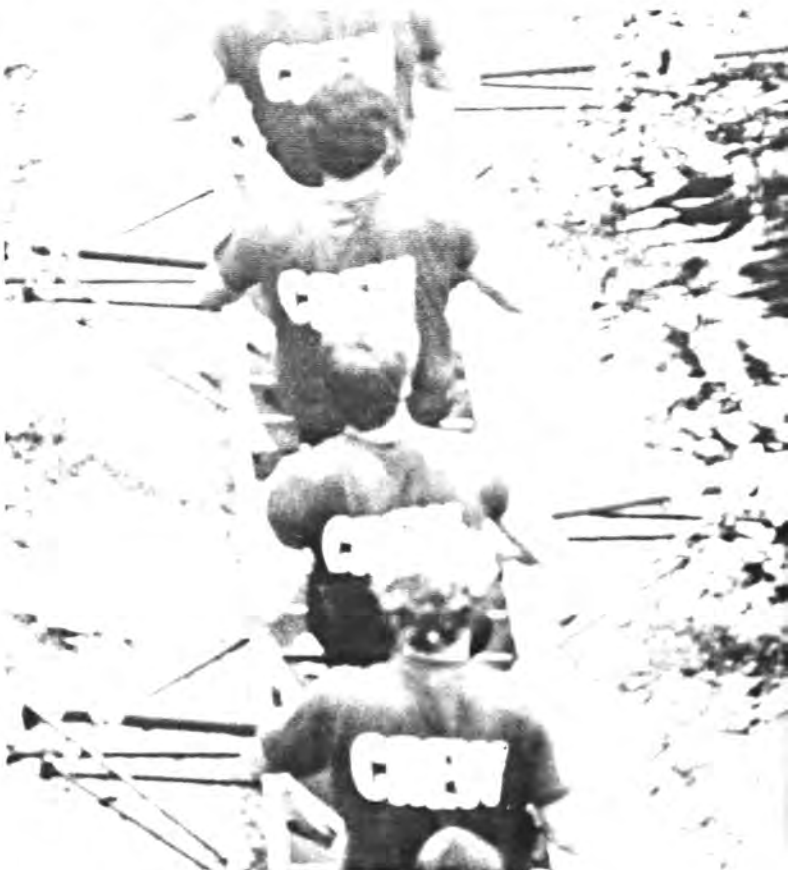

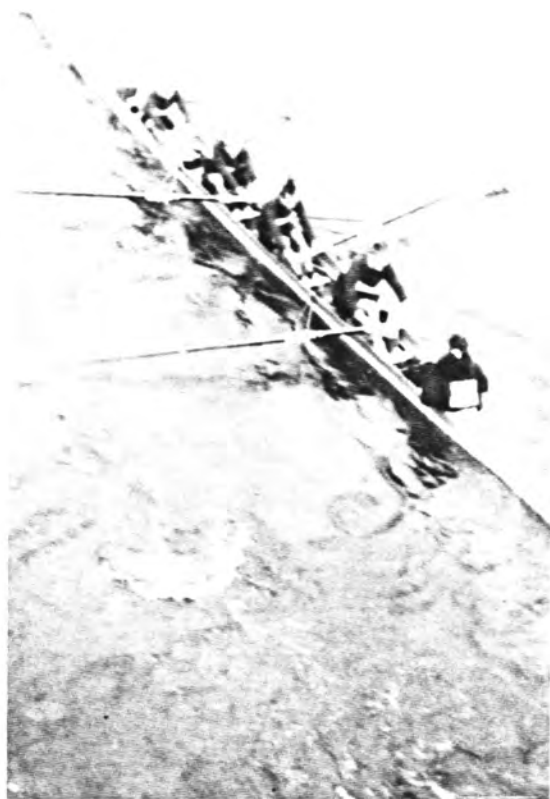
However, the students who join crew and are able to stick it out know that the benefits from it all far outweigh the hardships.

The class of 1991 founders have watched a bunch of confused group of "rowers" wearing mismatched outfits and sitting in big, leaky, wooden boats rowing all over the river become an organized team of matching, synchronized, powerful ROWERS sitting in brand new, (light) fiberglass boats winning ribbons and trophies. 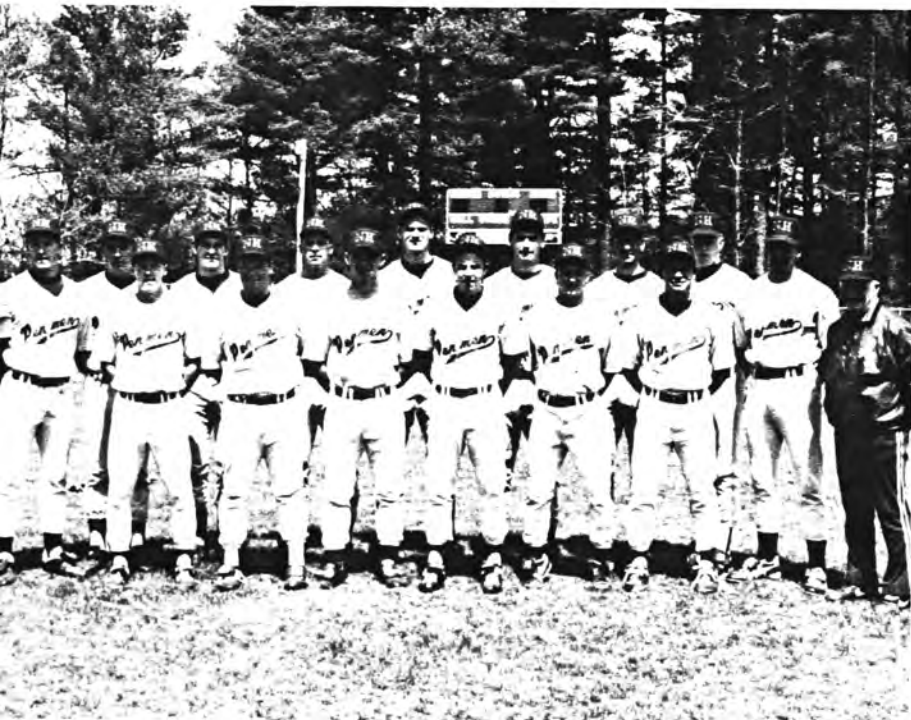
The Sideline

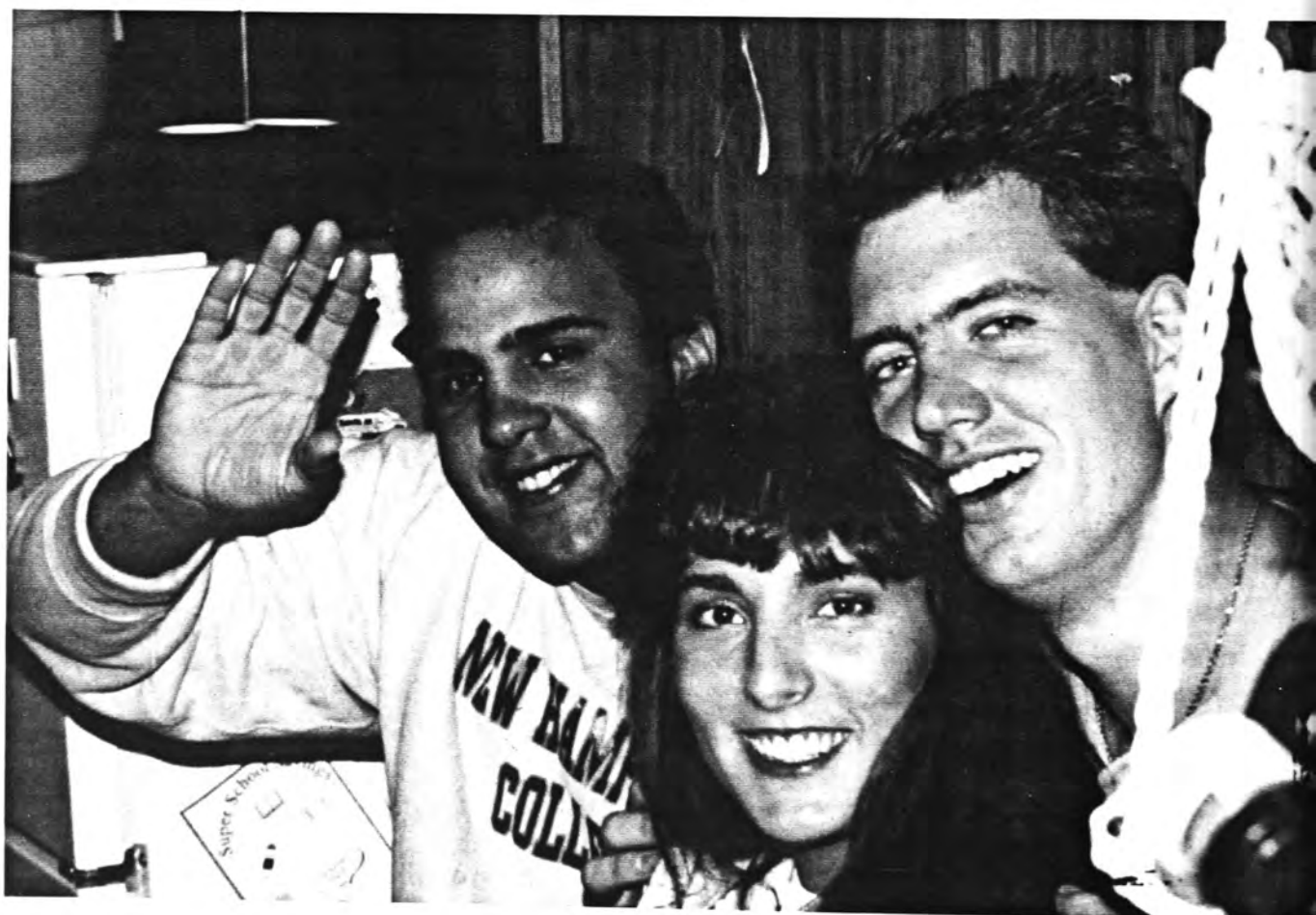
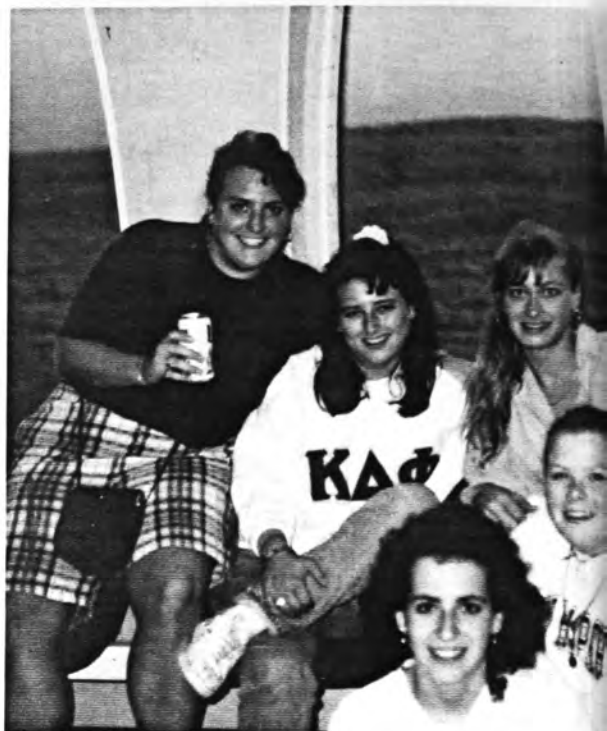
The 1991 season saw the NHC softball team finish with its most successful season since 1988, and recorded the most conference wins in the history of the program. The team finished with a record of 13-16.
