DR. CHARLIE CLEMENTS' career as an anti-war activist began the day he refused to fly any more combat missions in Viet Nam. That act of conscience led him to an El Salvador medical mission, a book and documentary film about his work in Central American (WITNESS TO WAR), and a leading role in the Central American peace effort. After the Viet Nam war, Dr. Clements received his M.D. and went to work at a clinic in Salinas, California, where he heard, first hand, the stories of Salvadoran refugees. Two years of negotiating later, Charlie Clements walked into El Salvador with 75 pounds of medical equipment on his back. Since his return to the United States, Dr. Clements has shared his experiences in WITNESS TO WAR, led Congressional fact-finding missions to Central America, met with Presidents of El Salvador, Honduras, and Nicaragua, and taken on the exacting role of Director of Human Rights Education for the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee. He also serves as National Co-Chair of PAX AMERICAS, a political action committee that is committed to a political solution to the conflicts in Central America.

ED ASNER is an actor with an impressive list of professional credits and currently principal of an inner city high school in the network series, THE BRONX ZOO. However, to most, he is best remembered as the crusty news director and editor, Lou Grant. When not acting and involved in his production company, this veteran actor is an activist and leading spokesperson for peace in Central America. A founding member of Medical Aid for El Salvador and PAX AMERICAS, Asner is also an advisory board member of several other humanitarian organizations and a willing participant in documentaries and public service announcements of political and social concern.
