Women's Soccer

After winning just two of their first nine games, the NHC Women's Soccer Team won four of their final eight games and closed out the year with a 6-11-0 record. Highlights of the season included a 1-0 victory over Bentley College, A 3-2 overtime win at Adelphi university and a 2-1 overtime victory over the University of New Haven. NHC also put a scare into regional power Franklin Pierce College, as the Ravens needed three late goals to post a 3-1 victory over NHC. The win over Adelphi set the stage for a strong finish. Adelphi, which entered the game with a 7-2-0 record, held 2-1 lead late in the second half, but Heather Klorer's third goal of the game just 40 seconds into overtime lifted NHC to the win. Klorer was hampered by a knee injury all year, but still managed to lead the team in scoring with 16 points and closed out her career ranked second in both career goals (30) and career points (77). Head coach Terry Prouty will return several key players next fall, including forward Anna Turbe, midfielders Julie Gammon, Nicole Bradley and Erica Flynn, defenders Tiffany Mulally and Tabitha Schwotzer and goal tenders Lori Scandura and Anastasia Carson.

Men's Soccer

The Men's Soccer Team posted an 11-2-1 record over their final 14 games and closed the year with a 13-4-5 record. Along the way the Penmen claimed the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament title and made their fourth-straight appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament. Seeded fifth in the NE-10, the Penmen headed to Assumption College for a quarterfinal game against the fourth-seeded Greyhounds. The teams battled through 120 minutes of scoreless soccer. Long-time nemesis Southern Connecticut State was up next in the tournament semifinals. A goal by freshman Ryan Hamilton with 21 minutes left in the second half gave NHC the lead, and Penmen held on for a 1-0 victory over the top-seeded Owls. It marked NHC's first victory over SCSU since 1999. The NE-10 championship game pitted the Penmen against cross-town rival St. Anselm. Richard Walker's goal off a direct kick with just 3:02 left to play in regulation lifted the Penmen to another 1-0 victory and the NE-10 title. Goaltender Tobias Svantesson was named tournament MVP after making 10 saves in the win over Southern Connecticut and four more in the championship game.

The team's finish earned NHC a bid to the 16-team NCAA Division II Tournament. The penmen prevailed against their rival St. Anselm, with the help of Sr. Dan Lindenmann's goal in the 1st half, earned the team a 1-0 victory and the New England regional title. The team's quest for a second national title came to an end, following a 4-2 loss at the East Stroudsburg University in the national quarterfinals. We were disappointed with not making the final 4, but I am very proud of the way this team played down the stretch," said head coach Tom Poitras. "They showed alot of pride."

Freshman Kristin Sidie placed first among NHC runners in all seven events and posted a personal-best time of 21:12 at the Northeast-10 Championship. It ranked as the third fastest time in the six-year history of the program. Seniors Tara and Melissa Cowdrey both capped off their careers by posting persona; -best times at the season-ending Northeast-10 Championship.

Freshman Justin Kochanowski showed improvement throughout the year and closed out his rookie season with a personal-best time of 32:37 at the Northeast-10 Championship. Women's Basketball

The Women's Basketball team showed signs of improvement under second year head coach Dennis Masi and turned in a solid showing in its first season as a member of the competitive Northeast-10 Conference. NHC finished with a 5-21 overall record and a 3-19 mark in the league. A closer look reveals that 10 of the team's losses were by 10 points or less. The highlights of the season was an exciting 68-67 overtime victory over NCAA Regional Champion Pace University and a season series sweep of cross-state rival Franklin Pierce College. Junior Anna Bell made an immediate impact on the team after transferring to NHC from Slippery Rock University. She led the team in scoring and rebounding and collected team MVP honors. She was also honored as NHC's Female Athlete of the Year. Senior Elise Sharkey became the first player in program history to record 200 three-pointers, while newcomer Shannon Drury ranked second on the team in scoring. Senior Loretta Kavanaugh concluded her four-year career.

Men's Basketball

A stretch of 12-straight winning seasons came to an end for the Men's basketball team in 2000-01. Plagued by injuries and illness throughout the year, the Penmen still managed to win seven of their 12 games, but struggled down the stretch and finished with an 11-16 overall record. NHC earned a spot in the Northeast-10 conference Tournament, but was eliminated in the opening round following an 89-77 loss at Pace University. 12 of the team's 16 losses were by nine points or less and seven were by five points or less. Sophomore Sotirios Karapostolou led the team to their 7-5 start, but was slowed by an ankle injury over the second half of the season. He still managed to lead the team in scoring (15.2 ppg) and assists (6.18 pg) and collected third-team All-Northeast-10 Conference honors. Junior Tim Lee ranked second among the NE-10 leaders in three-point field goals and became just the fifth player in program history to record 200 three-pointers. Additional leadership came from sophomore Brian Larrabee and junior Namdi Williams.

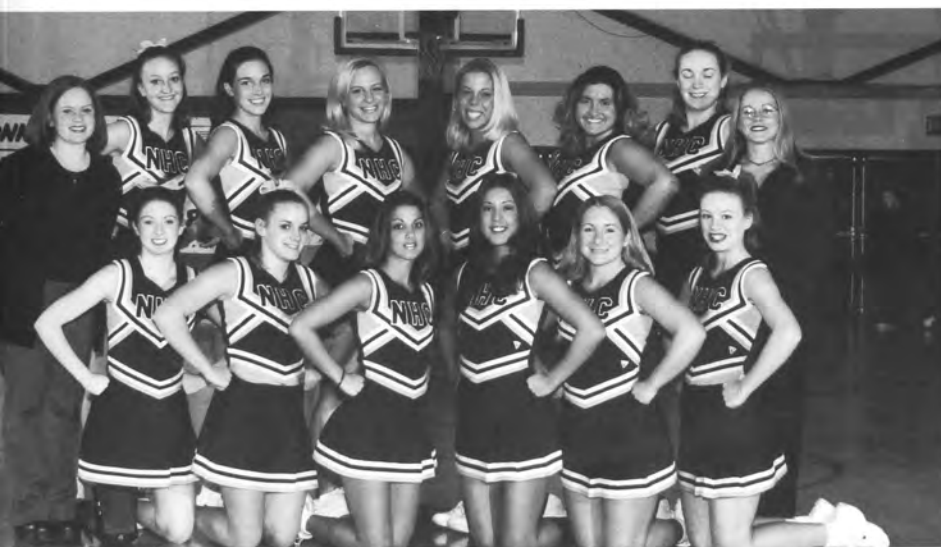

Hockey

The NHC hockey team won 11 of its final 14 games & closed out the year with a 17-8-1 record. Advanced to the championship game of the ECAC Division II Tournament for the second-straight year following a 5-2 victory over Stonehill College in the tournament semifinals. NHC was denied the ECAC title for the second-straight year by cross-town rival Saint Anselm College. Senior Chuck Croteau totaled 44 points and was named ECAC Northeast Division II Player of the Year. He closed out his career ranked second in both career assists(12) and career points(186)among the program's all-time leaders. Fellow seniors Rich Miller, Dan Roy and Scott Proulx also closed out their career ranked high among the program's all time leading scorers. Miller scored a team-high 18 goals and closed out his career ranked 3rd in career goals(83). Roy totaled a team-high 45 points and closed out his three-year career ranked 8th in career goals(65)and 10th in career points (133). Proulx totaled 30 points and ranks 11th in career points(128). Freshman goaltender Brian Holland named ECAC Northeast Division 2 Goaltender of the Year, while Dan Roy & fellow senior Tom Fielding collected honorable mention ECAC Northeast Division II all-star honors.

Lacrosse

The lacrosse team won 5 of its final 11 games and was in contention for a spot in the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament up until the final game of the season. The Penmen closed out the year with a 5-8 record and a 3-7 mark in the Northeast-10 Conference. Junior Mike Cesere enjoyed an outstanding season, as he set the school-record for points (85) and assists (32) in a season. He scored 53 goals and came just two goals shy of setting a new record for goals in a season. Newcomer Kyle Hintlian set a record for most goals in a season by a rookie (39) and totaled 59 points. Additional offense came from senior Jon Winton (20 goals, 23 assists), freshman Dan Bierbower (18 goals, 15 assists) and seniors Matt Chadwell (12 goals, 7 assists) and Mike Kaskiewicz (11 goals, 6 assists). Defensive leadership came in the form of seniors Shaun Sleeper and Shawn McNamara and sophomore Kiel Lombardo and Nick Burke. Senior Brad Sylvester started 12 of 13 games in goal in his first season with the program and averaged 14 saves a game.

Golf was reinstated as a varsity sport in 2000. 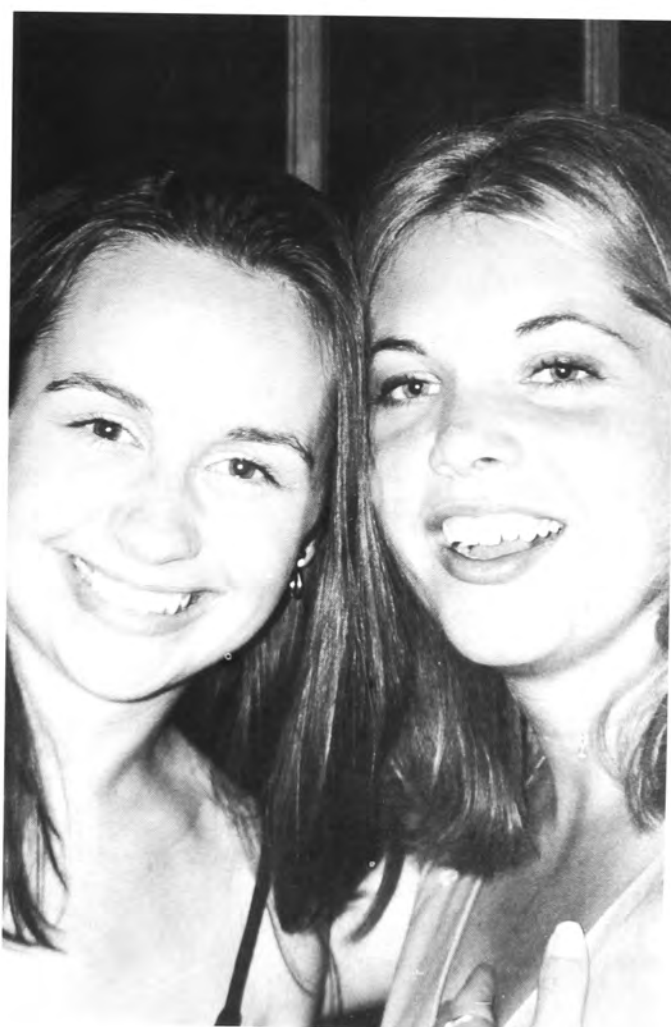












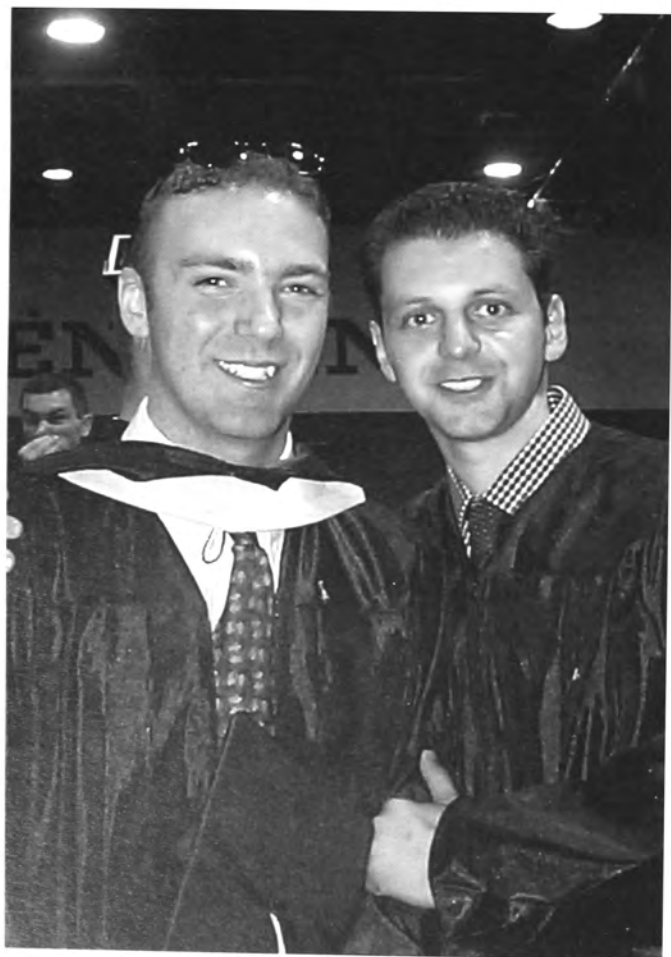
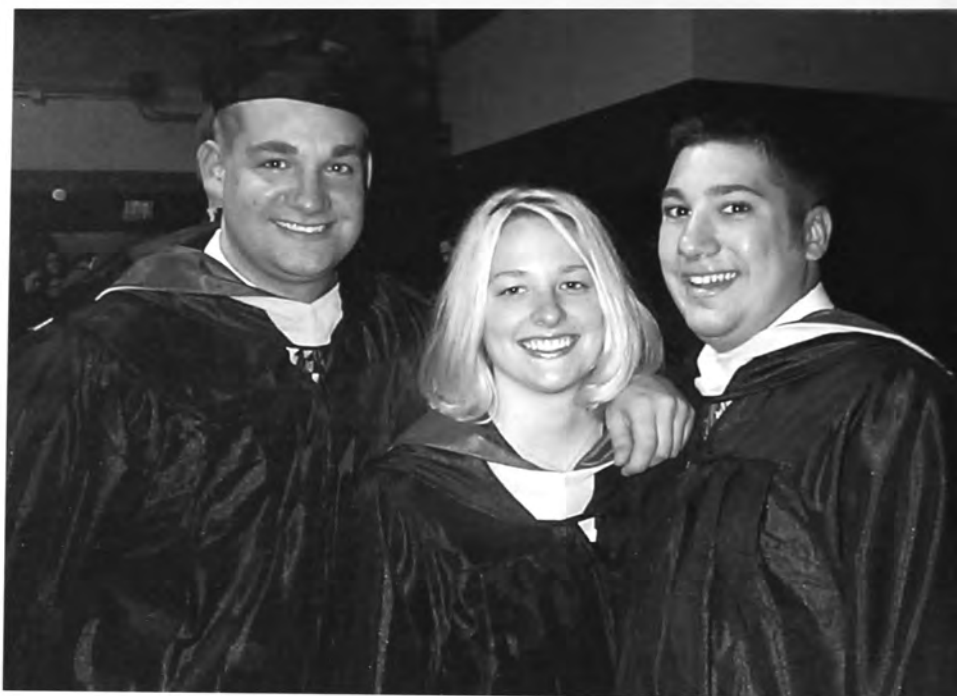


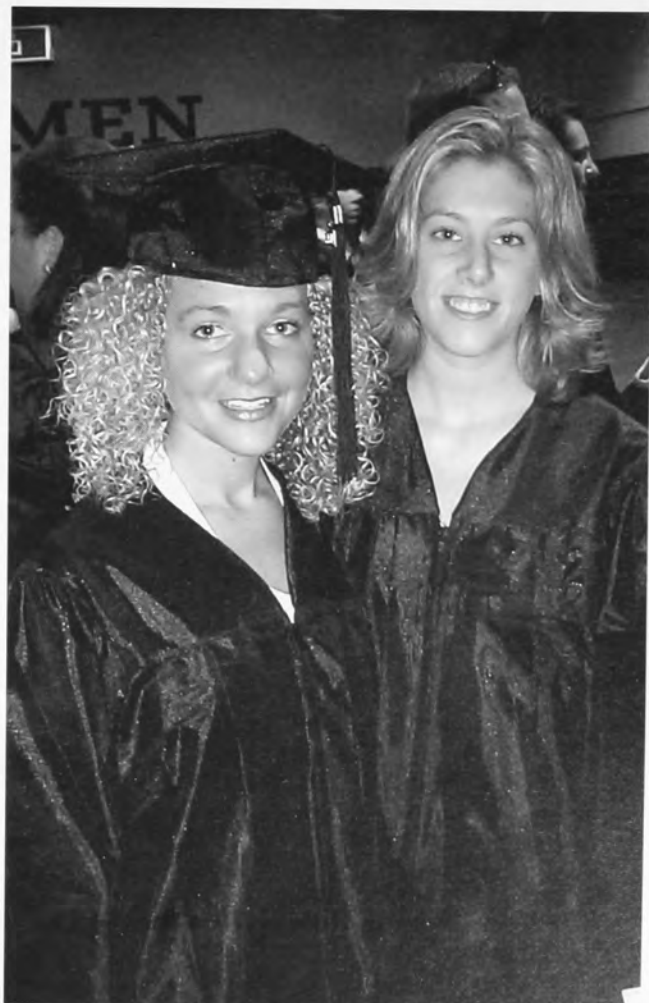


2001 Graduation
