Needs Assessment

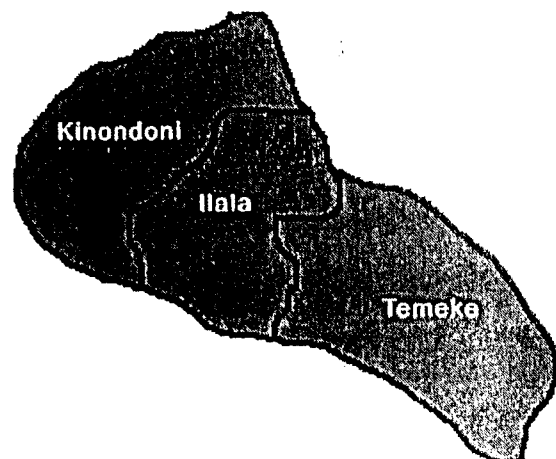
The following is the summary of the issues identified by the communities November, 1st.

2005

1. *Unemployment most Youth and women are unemployed in the ward hence many are indulging into unruly behaviours such as illicit drug substance abuse. .*
2. *Shortages of water, most of the houses are connected to DAWASCO water system. They get tape water three times a week.*
3. *Cholera outbreak, this happens especially during rain season.*
4. *Due to its population, the ward needs a secondary school,*
5. *More primary schools or more classrooms to cater for the rising numbers of pupils in the ward.*
6. *Absence of playing grounds and sports facilities for Youth and other residents*
7. *HIV/AIDS pandemic affects the families and aggravates the poverty to the community; education on the pandemic is needed to make community cope with the problem.*
8. *Occasional powers break down.*
9. *Malaria disease is another cause of morbidity and mortality in the ward*
10. *Garbage collection this is a persistent problem in the ward. Filthy is scattered all over the place posing the danger of disease outbreak*

Kwa ufupi naomba ridhaa ya kikundi ya kushirikiana nanyi katika kuteleleza yaliyotajwa hapo juu.

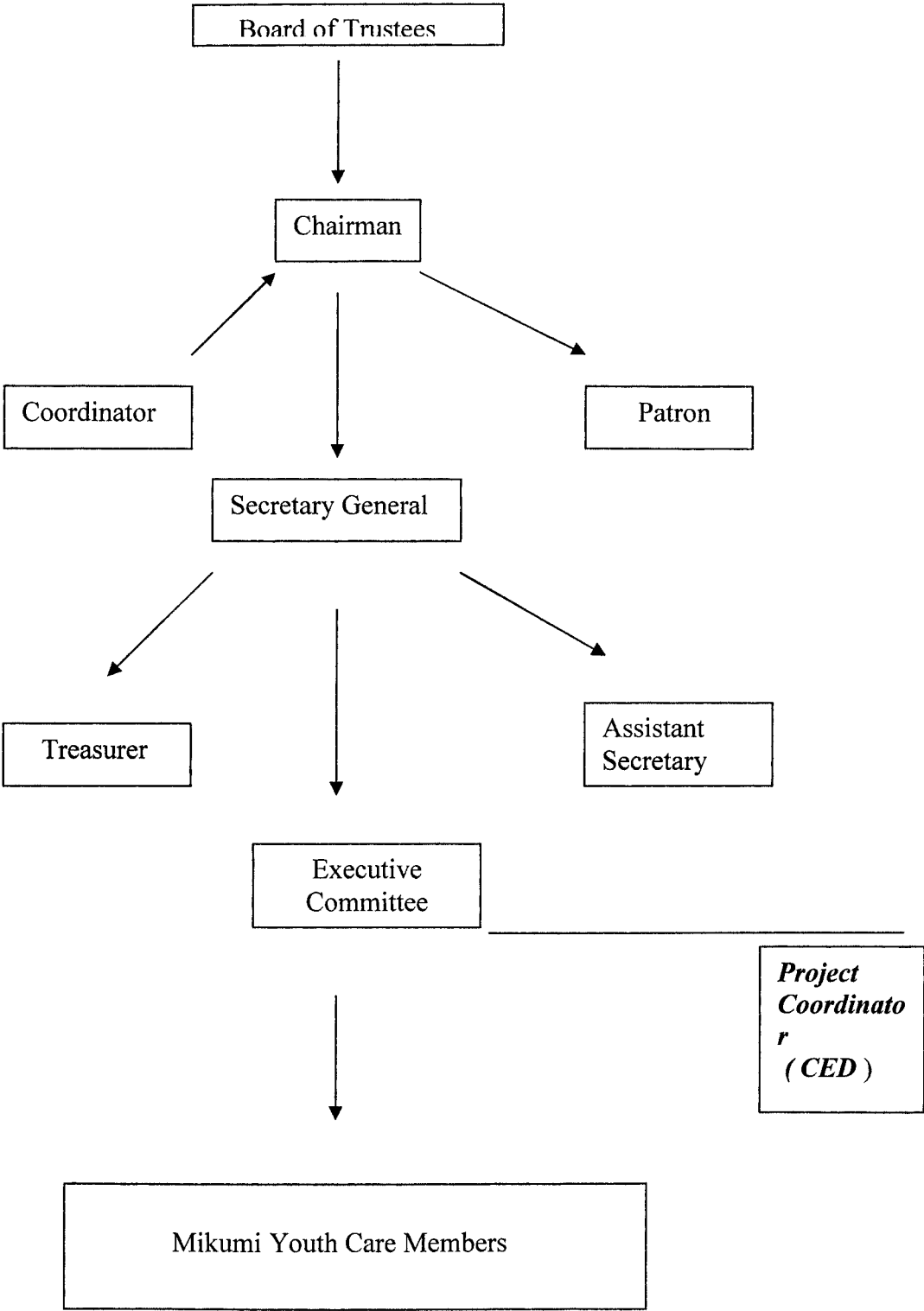
