RESPONSE

Dear M. C. Dunn:

We are writing this letter in response to your editorial in the Campus News of Thursday, February 28, 1974.

We hope that if your fellow students unite, that you will operate in a non-violent manner; however, why is it necessary to unite? Doesn't personal achievement, goals, etc., start with the individual, regardless if he is black, white, yellow or green?

Unification would be appropriate only if and when you and your colleagues are reaching for common goals. Not all black people, as you claim, may share your ideas, goals and philosophy.

In reference to "they" we do not understand who you are referring to--whites or Negroes? Who? If you are referring to whites, you have committed a very serious charge. We are speaking for ourselves only, we do not condemn you or your race for achieving self enrichment. Why are you listening to a few "they" and basing your feelings on what a few people say--you have a mind--use it! Form your own opinions!

We are both white students, reaching for a better education, and we too have been condemned by fellow whites for striving for a better education. However, we do not attentively listen for we know what is best for us and by being independent and individuals we are confident that we will achieve our personal goals. It becomes obvious that this ignorant attitude prevails in all races. There are good and bad members in any race.

Our final thought: the race problem will not be solved by racial laws. The problem will be solved only when people put behind their personal prejudices and biases. This will take a long time, and perhaps never; but Negroes and whites have one thing in common--we are all humans.
