OLIN ROBISON is president of the Salzburg Seminar, president emeritus of Middlebury College, Middlebury, Vermont and currently a professor at the College. He is a noted authority on United States and Russian affairs. Dr. Robison has served as a personal emissary for both President's Carter and Reagan on sensitive matters in the Soviet Union. He was the first chairman of the United States Advisory Commission on Public Diplomacy.

Since 1947, the Salzburg Seminar, a center for education and intercultural, interdisciplinary discussion in Salzburg, Austria, has been a critical link among academics, policy makers and political leaders in Europe, Russia and the United States. Seminar topics reflect cultural, economic, social and environmental concerns fostering dialogue among eminent conceptual thinkers, policy makers and mid-career professionals of exceptional promise.

Under Dr. Robison's tutelage, the Seminar plays a key role in international developments.

YELENA KHANGA, an Institute fellow at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University is a former correspondent for *Moscow News* and former commentator of "Vzglyad" ("View") a Russian talk show. She has appeared as guest on the *MacNeil/Lehrer Newshour*, "Posner and Donahue", ABC's "20/20" and CNN's "Sonya Live." As a journalist, Ms. Khanga participated in the first Washington summit between Presidents Gorbachev and Reagan.

Ms. Khanga has a Masters Degree in Journalism from Moscow State University. She lectures on Russian life and politics and is currently working on an autobiography and social history of her family. Her grandparents, a Jew and an African-American agronomist, migrated from the United States to the Soviet Union in 1931.
