

HENRY HAMPTON is founder and President of Blackside, Inc., a marketing, film and television organization which has been in continuous operation for over two decades. Hampton is Executive Producer of the famed historical documentary "Eyes on the Prize," the award-winning 14-hour PBS film series on America's civil rights movement. The first six-hour series was released in 1987 and won the prestigious Dupont-Columbia and Peabody awards for excellence in broadcast journalism, as well as two Emmys and an Academy Award nomination. Television Critics Association voted it "Best Program of the Season" and *TV Guide* named it "Best Documentary of the Year." It has been broadcast in ten different countries and distributed to hundreds of schools, libraries, and other institutions throughout the U.S. *Time* magazine said it "deserves top prize" and *The Boston Globe* called it "one of the most distinguished documentary series in the history of broadcasting." In 21 years at Blackside, Hampton has produced and been responsible for more than 50 major films and media projects including several multiple film series for J. Walter Thompson, the National Institute of Mental Health, and the U.S. Department of Commerce.

JULIAN BOND is a renowned active participant in the movements for civil rights, economic justice and peace, and an aggressive spokesman for the disenfranchised. In 1960, he became a co-founder of (SNCC), the Student Non-Violent Coordination Committee. Bond served influential terms in the Georgia House and Senate for nearly a decade. Elected a Senator in 1974, Bond became the first black Chair of the Fulton County Senate Delegation and the Committee on Consumer Affairs. During his service in the Georgia General Assembly he sponsored and co-sponsored over 60 bills which became law, including a pioneer sickle cell anemia testing program and a state-wide low-interest home loan program to low-income Georgians. Bond was narrator for the critically acclaimed 1987 and 1990 PBS series, "Eyes on the Prize." During the academic year of 1988-89 Bond was a visiting professor at Harvard University. Julian's commitment and dedication to civil rights and humanity continues to be unwavering.

PETER MEADE is the host of the Peter Meade Show, WBZ Radio, an issues-oriented talk show. Meade has won local and national awards including Associated Press Awards and the prestigious International Radio Festival (New York) Gold Medal Award. Additionally in 1974, under the Kevin White Administration, Peter was head of the Little City Halls Project and also Public Safety Coordinator during the explosive bussing crisis.
