Among his works are: **The Growth of the American Republic**, written and collaborated with Samuel Eliot Morison; **The Biography of Theodore Parker**; **The American Mind, Freedom, Loyalty, Dissent**; **Documents of American History**, over 600 documents from the age of discovery to the present; and dozens of others.

Teaching is his first love, and he has pursued it at Columbia, New York University, Cambridge, Oxford, and Amherst.
