THE BLUES AT NHC

Mance Lipscomb, a black blues man from Texas, will be at NHC tonight at 8:00 p.m. in the Student Center. The 77-year old Lipscomb, who has been a farm worker nearly all his life, describes the music form:

"We people had sad thoughts, so we sang sad songs - the blues. We sang to get things off our minds, the way we were living, the way we were treated. Son, you'd be sick if you knew some of the things we've been put through."

Though famous throughout his native Texas, Mance never played outside the state until - at the young age of 65 - he appeared at the 1961 Berkeley Folk Festival. Since then his talents have been appreciated throughout most of the U.S.A.

So, for an evening of Black country music in the raw, be at the NHC Student Center tonight.

EUROPEAN AFFAIRS

Dr. James Grace has arranged the visit on Wednesday, March 28 of an officer from the United States Department of State. Mr. John A. Baker, Jr., Director of the Office of European Affairs since April 1972, will spend the day on the NHC campus. Dr. Grace's office, in conjunction with Ernest Holm, Instructor in Government, has invited Mr. Baker to visit government and economics classes in addition to lecturing at noontime on Wednesday in the Little Theatre. Baker, a Yale graduate, continued his studies in Geneva, Switzerland. He began his career as a Foreign Service Officer in Belgrade, Yugoslavia in 1950, served as Political Officer at the U. S. Embassy in Moscow in 1957-58. Other Department of State posts he has held were in Italy, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland and the Baltic area.

It is expected that his lecture in the NHC Little Theatre will cover Eastern European topics, United States policies with regard to the Soviet Union and the European economy. A lively give and take between audience and lecturer is anticipated during the question and answer period.
